#### MISSION AND CATHOLIC IDENTITY

Our dedication to the Catholic faith is our foundation, it guides all the work we do as an institution. This year we supported and coordinated many faith-based projects.

- Weekly school-wide Mass in person
- Donated 2000 backpacks to the Good Shepherd Catholic Church Backpack Program
- Hired a new campus minister
- Parish luncheon involving all area parish leadership-priests, secretaries, DREs, and youth ministers

#### SPIRITUALITY, ACADEMICS, ARTS, and ATHLETICS

Our faculty, staff, teachers, and administration toiled vigorously to uphold our high academic standards. Teachers were able to provide in-person instruction throughout the school year to provide the best learning and student life possible.

The Class of 2022 exemplifies the outstanding results of our exceptional efforts:

- ACT average 25.5 (state average 18.7 / national average 20.3)
- Over \$10.5 million in merit-based scholarships
- 5 National Merit Qualifiers / 1 National Merit Semifinalist / 1 National Merit Finalist
- 2 collegiate scholarships for athletics
- 43 Advanced Placement Scholars (11 with Honor and 13 with Distinction)
- 26 Inductees to Mu Alpha Theta (Math Honor Society)
- 40 Inductees to the Georg von Tiesenhausen National Honor Society

Our Fine Arts programs provided a wide variety of thrilling performances:

- Sacred Arts Concert and Art Show
- Senior Favorites Concert and Art Show for our band, choir, and art students; all live shows
- Spring Musical performed live and in person
- Spring Concert and Art Show in the JPII gym
- 5 Superior ratings at instrumental Solo and Ensemble
- 1 student named to All-State Band
- Theatre students participated in District and State Trumbauer and Alabama Thespian Festival
- 20 students qualified for State Trumbauer with 13 Superior Ratings and 7 Excellent Ratings. In addition, 3 students placed in the top 3 of their category. The JPII Studio One Act Performance was given the top award, Best in Show.



Our Athletic programs shined and accomplished many new highs:

- Boys Cross Country won the State Championship Meet for the third consecutive year
- Girls Tennis won Sectionals and finished third in the State Championships
- Girls Basketball advanced to the playoffs in back-to-back years and hosted the area tournament for the first time in school history
- Individual State Champion wrestler in the 132 pound weight class
- Girls Soccer advanced to the Elite Eight of the State Tournament
- Boys Soccer won the area for back-to-back seasons
- Softball played their first home game on campus on March 10, 2022 and doubled their win total from the year before
- Baseball made the playoffs for back-to-back years for the first time
- Numerous school records in individual and relay events were set in both indoor and outdoor track and field
- Renovated hitting facility with the construction of a concrete pad, installation of a garage door entryway, and new turf

Continuing commitment to service and fellowship with several community organizations and groups:

- 9,368 Hours of Community Service for Class of 2022
- Provided Christmas gifts for more than 50 foster children in support of Kids to Love through Advent Angel Tree Project
- Sponsored 3 children through the UNBOUND organization, raising approximately \$1,500 per year in support
- Catholic Relief Services Club had two fundraisers for CRS during the school year; Fall Fundraiser, and the Lent Rice Bowl. These events raised \$3,500 for the 2021-2022 school year
- LinkCrew and Student Ambassadors continued to host events like New Student Orientation and New Family Night. LinkCrew hosted monthly socials and academic follow-ups with the Freshmen

#### St. John Paul II Catholic High School House System Formed

In 2021, St. John Paul II Catholic High School launched the inaugural House System. At JPII, every student, faculty, and staff member belongs to one of four houses. Each House is represented by an important aspect of St. John Paul II's life and mission. The goal of the House System is to provide an opportunity for students and faculty to interact across grade levels in healthy competition and support each other as they grow in their Catholic faith. Students learn to work hard individually for the good of their house, in addition to working as a team. The JPII House System encourages teamwork, friendship, service, and leadership. Houses compete against each other in the areas of academics, athletics, behavior, school spirit, and community service through quarterly accolades in academics and behavior, in House service projects, and House games.

#### St. John Paul II Catholic High School House System Goals

- 1. Encourage our Catholic Identity as St. John Paul II Catholic High School
- 2. Increase community which is evident in faculty and student retention, and encourage participation in various school events
- 3. Provide opportunities for student leadership through student-created and led events
- 4. Increase student retention through all goals

#### St. John Paul II Catholic High School Leadership Council

This program challenges student leaders and their respective councils to take on the real responsibility of serving their community and learn from the experience. It removes the hope that our students will graduate as leaders and replaces that hope with success through House events and projects that make them leaders. We move past the theoretical to introduce the practical, with real struggles and with real successes. In this way we hope to amplify our sense of community by bringing administration, faculty, and students together with energy and focus to make each year at JPII greater than the year before.

The House System placed 16 new students into key leadership positions which provided more leadership opportunities than we've ever had in the past. The Houses created, coordinated, and participated in service projects in the Huntsville community throughout the school year.

#### **OPERATIONAL VITALITY**

Again, true to our Catholic mission, we require less in tuition dollars than it costs to educate each student at St. John Paul II. This year, we established the school's first endowed scholarship – The Bishop David E. Foley Scholarship Endowment. We plan to finalize the specifics of the program this fall and award our first scholarships for 2023.

Through hardwork and dedication, the *Helping Hands, Thankful Hearts* campaign, led by Dr. Russell, our students, the Parent Association, our alumni, and the development office, raised a wonderful \$165,639. The Falcon Booster Club held the Fr. Louis Giardino Falcon Classic Golf Tournament in the spring, raising more than \$39,000 to support the athletic programs.

Through the facilities fee, we continue to keep up with repairs and maintenance, and have a reserve to provide for any future capital needs of the current JPII building and facilities. Funds supporting the operational and program needs benefited our JPII students this year.

- Purchase of over 30 SMART Boards \$101,172
- Tuition Assistance awarded \$187,500
- Purchase of new textbooks \$57,653
- Purchase of new computers \$5,327

While during the end of the pandemic, community outreach persisted:

- JPII began offering a cybersecurity course (RING) in partnership with UAH. We are the only school in the region and the only private school in the state to offer this particular course
- JPII introduced an intersession week that provided seniors with an opportunity to job shadow. We will expand intersession week for both juniors and seniors next year
- JPII students were represented and/or spoke at every parish Mass during Catholic Schools Week


