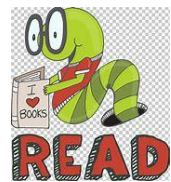

**How can I possibly win a prize?** Attendance will be submitted into a drawing for prizes

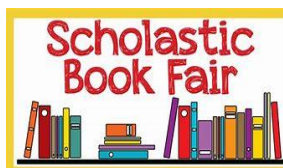
