

**Course Description:** *Spanish I* is an introduction to the speaking, listening, reading, writing, and understanding of the language and culture. *Spanish II* is a continuation of the topics learned in *Spanish I* and will include more basic vocabulary and conversational skills.

### Reglas de la Clase: (class rules)

- Respect the teacher, students, and the classroom.
- Be kind. NO negativity or bad will toward anyone. in class
- Be responsible. You do it, you own up to it.
- Do not line up at the door at the end of class. (school wide rule)
- NO phones allowed without my specific permission. ALWAYS ask first!
- Participate and have fun!

### Choosing not to follow class procedures:

This classroom is run with respect. If there are issues, please conduct yourself in a respectful manner. I am understanding and cooperative and know that everyone has a bad day sometimes. However if it becomes a pattern and you fail to work with me to resolve any issues, you leave me no choice but to take it to the next level. My levels of action:

1. One-on-one conference. Your time to voice your side and explain yourself. Slow down, compromise, and explain. I don't know if you don't tell me. **COMMUNICATION IS KEY!**
2. Repeated offences get phone calls to home and/or administration gets involved depending on the severity.
3. Administrative referral.

**\*\*Any extreme and/or inappropriate behavior will be sent to administration immediately.**



### BOLETOS (tickets):

Boletos will be given out for participation during class for a wide range of reasons. To receive a 100 participation grade for each quarter, you must collect 50 boletos by the end of that quarter. (Making 100 total to be collected during the entire semester.)

### **IF YOU ARE ABSENT FOR ANY REASON, YOU WILL NOT HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO EARN MISSED BOLETOS.**

**\*\*Any extra boletos earned will be redeemable for extra credit, etc. that may be offered at the end of the semester.**

### Bathroom Policy:

It is understood that we are all adults who may need to use the restroom throughout the day. I expect you to be respectful and not abuse going to the bathroom. If a student starts going habitually, there will be a teacher conference and/or rights to leave class revoked. Students should go during class change.

Unless it's an emergency, please wait until after the lesson to go to the restroom. Try to go during a downtime point during class. You are responsible for getting anything you missed while out from another student.

**\*If you ask to go to the bathroom, that's where you should be. Please do not break my trust.**

### If you're absent:

Check the Daily Class Log on the class site for the day you missed. A log is kept of each days activities/assignments. If you missed a handout, check the make-up work folder. Talk to your classmates to copy missed notes/information from that day. If you have any further questions, see me. It is your responsibility to see me to make up tests & quizzes. Please do not do this at the beginning or middle of class.

**You are allowed an equal number of days to complete make-up work as the number of days that you missed. For example: A student who is absent 3 days should have all work turned in by the third day they have returned to school. (This is a school wide policy.)**

### Late work:

Assignments are given to help prepare you for the test. Use your time wisely. It is important to be on time with your assignments.

**LATE WORK POLICY:** A student who does not have an assignment completed and ready to turn in the day the assignment is due will receive a 20% point deduction. Assignments 2 or more days late receive a zero per school policy.

**How your grade is determined:**

**\*Exams & Unit Tests 40%** Corrections are offered ONLY if grade made is below a 60 and receive half credit back for a better grade (60 being the highest possible grade you may earn).

**\*Projects & Boleto Grade 30%** Projects are a LARGE portion of your grade & help to prepare for the test. There is plenty of time to complete during class. Use your time wisely. Your boleto grade is your participation grade. \*Please make sure you read and understand the boletos section.

**\*Unit Work & Quizzes 30%** Quizzes will be given as practice for the Unit Test. They will help you gauge what you need to study/practice before the big test grade. Use them as a study tool to preview the test/improve skills. See me for help with these before we get to the test. All Unit Work is given to practice the skills for the test (is not busy work!).

**\*\*\*Test/Quiz Incentive: For classes who win the "data wall" - each student in that class will receive 5 boletos for quizzes & 10 for tests.**
