### Assignment I: Get to know the Greeks

- You will be tested on your knowledge the most common Greek allusions. Please see the list below. Study for these in any manner you deem fit. You may already be familiar with many of them. If not, spend some time doing some research. The *Percy Jackson* series is a great place to start if you like learning through reading. You might want to create flashcards. **We will not be collecting anything for this.** All you need to do is know them. You will take a matching test on them during the first few weeks of school. For example, the answer might be “goddess of love.” Can you match that answer with the right name?

### Assignment II: Subjects and Verbs

- You need to be able to identify the subject(s) and verb(s) in a sentence. This is a basic skill that many of you have mastered, but many have not. All our grammar instruction is based on it. Knowing this will give you a solid head start. If you haven’t already, consider memorizing the 23 helping verbs. You can find great resources on the internet; just search for subject and verb practice. I’ve also created an optional practice class on No Red Ink. Go to: <https://www.noredink.com/join/important-robin-82> or log into your existing account on No Red Ink and add the class with the key: important robin 82. Remember, this practice is optional. I’ve provided it as help, but feel free to skip it if you feel confident about your skills. **We will not be collecting anything for this.** You will take a subject and verb pre-test in the first weeks of school.
