1B. Abstract

Use of Funds to Support the Development of Career Pathways:

Funds from the Perkins V Rural Innovation grant will be utilized by the Liberty County School District to support the ongoing development of the Allied Health Program and the Building Trades and Construction Technology programs at Liberty County High School.

The career path for the Allied Health Assisting (8417130) consists of the following courses: Health Science I, Health Science II, and Allied Health Assisting III. The program of study prepares student for advanced training in the health occupations industry. The Allied Health program emphasizes participation in HOSA, which will further expose students to careers in the health care industry, standards of professionalism and provide opportunities to participate in state level competition. These experiences assist our students in obtaining the knowledge and skills to prepare for careers in the health field.

The primary objective of the Allied Health program is to prepare students for employment and post-secondary studies in the health care industry. Participating students in this program will have the opportunity to earn industry certification as a Certified Medical Administrative Assistant. The program will further prepare students for post-secondary studies to include, but not limited to, allied health aide, medical assistant, medical laboratory assistant, occupational therapy aide, physical therapy aide, respiratory therapy aide or radiology aide. Students will be prepared for post -secondary study, in the health care industry, by engaging in rigorous academic instruction and the opportunity to participate in hands on activities related to a variety of medical occupations. These experiences will help prepare students for transition to postsecondary studies in the areas of nursing, physical therapy, pharmacy, dental assisting, and occupational therapy.

Funds will be used to support the development of this career pathway by supporting a portion of a salary for the Allied Health Teacher. In addition, funds will be used to purchase items such as hospital beds, wheelchairs, gait belts, Depco software for technical training and replacement supplies for medical carts.

The Building Trades and Construction Technology (8722000) program includes Building Trades Construction Design 1, 2 and 3. This sequence of courses provides rigorous content that is aligned with challenging academic standards, relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for future careers in Building Construction Technologies. The technical skills and competency based applied learning acquired in this program increases academic knowledge, higher order thinking, positive work attitudes, employability skills, occupation specific skills and knowledge of all aspects of the Building Trades Construction and Technology career cluster.

The primary objective of the Building Trades and Construction Technology program is to prepare students for employment and post-secondary studies in the building construction industry. Students participating in this program are provided the opportunity to earn industry certification for OSHA 10, and Welding. Students participating in this program will be be provided coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and technical skills that are needed to prepare for further education and careers in Architecture and Construction career cluster. SkillsUSA is the career and technical student organization associated with this program that empowers its members to become world-class workers, leaders, and responsible American citizens. This program improves the quality of our nation's future skilled workforce through the development of framework skills that include personal, workplace and technical skills grounded in academics.

Funds will be used to support this career pathway by paying a portion of the Building Trades and Construction Technologies teacher's salary.

Use of CLNA to Inform Selection of Career and Technical Education Programs and Activities:

Services and activities:

Programs are reviewed to determine if they meet size, scope and quality. The programs selected meet SSQ, Engagement and workforce alignment is demonstrated by the following.

- All programs are reviewed for their placement on the State TOL and DOL. Programs
 meet with their business and industry partners to discuss the local workforce demand
 and ways the school district is assisting in meeting that need. The CLNA conducted this
 past year included conversation with these stakeholders and contributed to program
 enhancement, modification, or omissions.
- These CTE programs follow the DOE Curriculum Frameworks which are designed to assist students in making informed decisions regarding their future academic and occupational goals. By teaching the standards associated with each course, Career and Technical Education provides a path for practical application of academic content. The content includes the development of academic skills, leadership skills, communication skills and employability.
- Hands on instruction is critical for students to receive the full benefit of CTE instruction. To that end, the funds made available through the Perkins allocation enables us to provide instructional staff to provide both academic and hands on teaching in relevant career pathways.
- CTE instructors are provided opportunities to attend applicable professional development. Networking and professional development are two important opportunities for continued growth.

Additionally, district and school administration will continue to place a high emphasis on industry certification. Teachers will review the curriculum alignment associated with their course frameworks and will continue to implement rigorous reading standards. Students that need additional reading instruction are provided Tier II interventions in an intensive reading class in accordance with the district's reading plan. Funding for reading intervention is provided through the district reading allocation.
