Dear Parishioners,

Last Saturday was a sad day for our nation. While the full truth is yet to be revealed, I hope that no matter what side of the political spectrum we are, we can agree that killing others is always wrong. This is why we need to be more discerning with the news programs we watch. If we are feeding ourselves with a steady diet of conspiracy stories, half-truths, and soundbites taken out of context, we more easily dehumanize others, even to demonizing them. In that context, it becomes easy to justify radical things – we rationalize it away with 'rational lies.' This is for all sides of the spectrum.

The Catholic position on politics allows for discussion in a wide range of topics, but there are non-negotiables. Abortion and euthanasia are always wrong, and as Catholics, we cannot outright support these practices or those that would promote them. There is some prudential judgment needed in the best way forward to eliminate the practices.

We can discuss the best ways of welcoming the migrant, but limiting the access points through the erection of walls is a legitimate means of doing so. There are principles of subsidiarity (letting the smallest entity that can deal with the issues) and solidarity (working together toward our common good) that ought to be respected.

Tradition family structures need to be protected and promoted – in fact time and again, we see social science confirming what the Church has long taught about the nuclear family of father, mother, and children.

As a nation, we need to get back to discussion of principles and seeking to fulfill our responsibilities. For too long, we perhaps have focused on rights. We need to remember the value of work and know that that which is strenuously worked for is well earned, and stop entitlement in all its forms. We need to take care of the vulnerable, those who cannot work, but that is different than taking care of those who will not work. In doing so with all of these and so much more, we will stop the attacks on people, and seek the best for our country.

We are asked, even in the Scriptures, to pray for those who lead us. Whether we agree with all the positions our leaders hold or not, we ought to pray for God's will to be done. Praying for the personal failure of our leaders does no good – praying for the failure of bad policies is laudable, and praying for the conversion of all to the Truth of Jesus Christ and all that entails is our duty.

# **REFLECTION** ~ Think about this ...

- The Lord works slowly in us. But at times, it seems that nothing changes, even when we receive the Eucharist. That is because the sacraments are not magic. We have free will, which means we must respond to God's grace. The grace is there, but too often we put up obstacles to it. Our bodies, hearts, and minds are often not prepared to receive him worthily. We cooperate by preparing ourselves for Holy Communion.
- Preparation for the Mass can be proximate and remote (immediate and in advance). Proximate preparation is done on Sunday and during the Mass, leading up to Holy Communion. Remote preparation is done days before Sunday. We will touch on the importance of both, but we can begin to see that it entails living differently, and not just saying some prayers on Sunday.
- For now, let us reflect on what obstacles may be preventing us from receiving the grace of Holy Communion. Is it laxity, daydreaming, attachments, or other problems? What can you do to keep these things from robbing you of this grace? Learn to see the Lamb who dwells in your midst.

#### Let us pray.

Lord, you are the Lamb who takes away our sins and makes us whole. Grant us humility and reverence to recognize you hidden under the appearance of bread and wine and receive you as you deserve, as our true Physician and Lord.
