

First Grade

February is a rigorous month for First Graders.

In Math, the student will be learning the various aspects of measurement and applying their addition and subtraction skills to evaluate and solve problems. In English Language Arts (Reading), the students are expected to take on more responsibility for their own learning, such as reading directions on their own, composing and writing complete sentences, forming effective study habits. In Science, we will begin our unit on Earth and Space focusing on the stars. In Social Studies, we will explore maps and the physical features of the Earth. When your First Grader comes home exhausted, they have worked hard to grow their brains in preparation for 2nd Grade.

In second grade we have several things we will be working on for the month of February. In reading, How kids around the world are different.




SAC & PTO

Home and School Connection

Without doubt, reading with children spells success for early literacy. Putting a few simple strategies into action will make a significant difference in helping children develop into good readers and writers.

Through reading aloud, providing print materials and promoting positive attitudes about reading and writing, you can have a powerful impact on children's literacy and learning.

- Invite a child to read with you every day.
- When reading a book where the print is large, point word by word as you read. This will help the child learn that reading goes from left to right and under stand that the word he or she says is the word he or she sees.
- Read a child's favorite book over and over again.
- Read many stories with rhyming words and lines that repeat. Invite the child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as he or she reads along with you.
- Discuss new words. For example, "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?"
- Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.
 Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, songbooks, poems and information books.

Reading well is at the heart of all learning. A child who can't read well, can't learn. Help make a difference for a child.
