If your child hasn't already started a writing journal, I encourage him/her to do so. Writing journals are great ways to practice handwriting, stretch creativity, and experiment with story components.

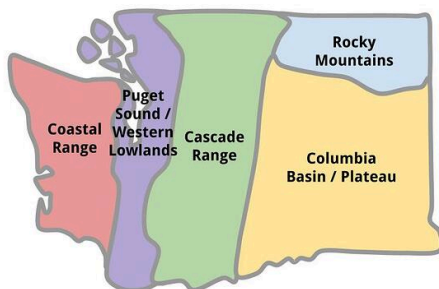
