Eversource Hardship and Matching Payment Programs: The COVID-19 moratorium on utility service disconnections ended on September 15 for residential non-hardship customers. School Nutrition Program: The State Department of Education has shared that throughout the pandemic, food manufacturers and distributors have incurred costly shifts in their product development, packaging, and distribution to adjust to supply shortages and the changing needs of the consumer food industry. The school food manufacturing and distribution industry is facing many of the same challenges, including staffing and labor shortages, and rising costs of materials and transportation. Therefore, please note that the <u>issues with supply</u> chains may impact school menus, resulting in a decrease in the availability of the usual variety of food items, requiring repeated and unpredictable last-minute adjustments to school menus and offerings. Thank you for your understanding when we do need to adjust menus.

Students can leave their non-perishable donations on a table in the lobby.
