



Houston County made a strong debut on April 2, 2025, at the 2025 Georgia State FLEX (Foundational Leadership and Entrepreneurship Experience) Finals held in Tifton, Georgia; placing 2nd in the state during its very first year competing. Izzy Peek, Veterans High School Senior, Audio-Video Technology and Film student, earned 2nd place overall and a \$5,000 grant for her business, CATCH Videography, which specializes in sports and event filming.

On March 17, 2025, she also competed at the Houston County local FLEX at Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC), with three other Houston College and Career Academy (HCCA) students: Roderick Denson Jr. owner of HTK Designs (Veterans High School Barbering student), Lynese Ellington, owner of Lavish Scents (Warner Robins High School Latin student), and Bella Nations owner of Bella Kaye's Salon, (Perry High Barbering student). All four students earned funds to help launch their businesses.

The FLEX program is all about turning big ideas into real businesses with guidance, mentorship, and financial support to help students succeed. The students kicked off their business ideas in August at HCCA, where students worked closely with staff, board members, and community mentors. The Development Authority also provided access to the talents and experience of the team at Spark Macon, Robert Grant and Sierra Martin. Throughout the process. they learned what it takes to build a brand, pitch their ideas, and grow a business from the ground up. And based on this year's results, Houston County's future entrepreneurs are off to an amazing start.






