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## REPORTS

Vo-Tech Operating Committee representative Mr. Jason Corte reported that the vo tech will have its open house October 12 and that the October JOC meeting is scheduled for next week. Current enrollment is about 780 students.

Superintendent Mr. Pete Noel reported the following:

- The budget process has begun and the Act 1 Index is now out. The district will consider a tax increase as it has done every other years. The proposed bill to change the date of the primary elections could impact our budgeting deadlines.
- New legislation which could clarify the number of days or hours of instruction required for students could add some flexibility to our school calendar.
- At the last in-service program, staff looked at Linklt! data to understand student performance measures and keep their pulse on learning. They also had an introduction to STEEL standards.
- Administration and staff are working on a K-12 guidance/graduation plan.
- Clarification is being sought on questions brought by the board and administration.
- There is currently legislation in the state house and senate concerning cyber-charter schools and legal notice requirements.
- Policies to be considered in the upcoming months by the board are use of force, district-owned cell phones and crowdfunding. Currently the district owns three cell phones for use by the custodians which are ruggedized flip phones. The policy would address those phones. The use of force policy is a hybrid of a policy provided by Attorney Ron Repack's office and what the county prison uses as provided by Mr. Smith. The crowdfunding policy would be a way to fundraise within certain parameters to eligible sites and could help manage hour money is raised. Mr. Noel asked the board to review these policies and reply if they would like to implement them.

Director of Special Education Mr. Troy Eppley was absent.
High School Principal Mr. Jeremy Burkett reported the following:

- In athletics, Trae Kargo advanced to districts in golf; hockey season started October 10; recognition of Trissa Smith for 1,000 assists.
- Next month, Mr. Bubba Fatula will conduct Run, Hide, Fight exercises with the high school students.
- The Cambria County Suicide Prevention organization accepted a check from the volleyball team's suicide prevention game.
- The senior class will visit the Flight 93 Memorial this week.
- The band will march in the Johnstown Halloween Parade this month. The theme is "Glory Days".
- The end of the marking period is October 25.
- Senior night will be October 27 for football, cheer and band.


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Elementary School Principal Mrs. Jennifer Pisarski reported on the following:

- Students enjoyed the assembly "the magic of science" brought in by student council.
- This is fire prevention week. The fire company will hold a presentation for the elementary school on Friday.
- The first marking period incentive, a trip to Morrison's Cove for roller skating and bowling is coming up at the end of the month.
- The Halloween parade is scheduled for October 27.
- The Veteran's Program will be held November 9.

School Solicitor Dennis McGlynn, Esquire made his report during executive session.
Business Administrator Mr. Jeff Vasilko reported the following:

- The audit has been completed and there were no findings. The AFR is due October 30.
- The participation requirements for the CEP have gone down to $23 \%$. This will allow more schools to participate in the program to provide free breakfast and lunch to their student body. The concern now will be that there could be shortages in available food supplies.
- Pittsburgh Stage will be here this week to look at the elementary auditorium sound stage.
