Monday, May 15, 2017 Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes

On Monday, May 15, 2017, the Randolph County Board of Education met for their regular monthly Board of Education meeting in the Central Services Board Room at the 2222-C S. Open Session

Call to Order

Chairman Cook called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone.

1. Update on Summer Enrichment Camp at Southeastern Randolph Middle School Catherine Berry, Assistant Superintendent, presented an update on the Summer Enrichment Camp. The camp is designed to provide support to rising sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students at Southeastern Randolph Middle School through a summer week of community engagement. Applications have been process and finalized with total camp registrations of 97 students. Dates of the camp are set for June 19-22 and June 26-29.

Superintendent's Office/Board of Education

1. Recommendation to revise Board Policy 2330-Board Meeting Agenda (First Reading)
The Superintendent presented the revisions to Board Policy 2330 (First Reading). After review
and discussion, Matthew Lambeth made a motion to approve Board Policy 2330 as presented;
Emily Coltrane seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously. The second reading

Finance and Budget

1. Gift from Ella B. Lowe to the Randolph County School System

Todd Lowe. Finance Officer, shared that on 4/18/17, the Superintendent received a call from
William H. Flowe, Jr. (an attorney in Liberty) regarding a gift given to our school system by
Mrs. Ella B. Lowe in the amount of \$525,000. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lowe owned and operated
Dixie Equipment Company in Liberty for many years. Mr. Lowe shared that the gift was
received in the Superintendent's office on 4/21/17. Based on Board Policy 8220 (Gifts and
Bequests), the Superintendent accepted the gift on behalf of the school system and is being
presented to the Board for final approval. After review, Emily Coltrane made a motion; motion
was seconded by Brian Biggs to approve and accept the gift as presented. The motion passed
unanimously.

Operations

1. Recommendation to approve 2017-2018 bell schedules

Marty Trotter, Assistant Superintendent, presented the bell schedule for the 2017-2018 school year. He shared the only change being recommended to the schedule is for the new Uwharrie School Project. He presented a recommendation for the school day at Uwharrie to being at 7:40 a.m. and dismiss at 2:55 p.m. which would allow time for the Uwharrie students to be transported to Southwestern Randolph High School in the event they wish to participate in afterschool activities at the high school. Matthew Lambeth made a motion; motion was

seconded by Brian Biggs to approved the 2017-2018 bell schedule as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Uwharrie School Project Naming

Mr. Trotter shared that based on Board Policy 9300 (Naming Facilities), on behalf of the Uwharrie project design team, he was submitting Uwharrie 6-12 and Uwharrie Ridge 6-12 as names for the Board's consideration. Logo designs also were presented. After discussion, Emily Coltrane made a motion; the motion was seconded by Matthew Lambeth to approve "Uwharrie Ridge 6-12." Motion passed unanimously. A minor revision will be made to the logo and brought back as an information item at the June Board of Education meeting.
