PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese,

Although we won't celebrate her feast this year because it falls on a Sunday, I'd like to highlight our Carmelite saint of the day, **St. Teresa Margaret Redi**, one of the five canonized saints in the Carmelite Order named "Teresa/Therese". —Fr. Peter Mary



Teresa Margaret was born at Arezzo, Italy, on July 15, 1747, into the noble Redi family and was baptized Anne Mary. Guided to a deep sense of piety, she could already be called a "little contemplative" at the age of six, when she asked whomever was capable of answering her: "Tell me, who is this God?" Her tendency towards recollection and prayer was accentuated during her years spent at boarding school in the Benedictine monastery of St. Apollonia in Florence, where she was given a discreet liturgical instruction. Meanwhile, her spiritual life deepened in Eucharistic and Marian piety and in devotion to the Sacred Heart. The protagonist of this formation was her very devout father, Ignatius Redi, who was also her spiritual father. On her return to the family circle, Anne Mary revealed her vocation to Carmel, a vocation of which she became certain

during the last months of her schooling. On September 1, 1764, she entered the monastery of St. Teresa in Florence. She received the Carmelite habit on March 11, 1765, with the name of Teresa Margaret of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. At the age of twenty-two, peritonitis cut short her life on March 7, 1770. Pius XI beatified her on June 9, 1929, and canonized her on March 13, 1934. Her feast day is September 1st.

Her life was devoid of any eventful or extraordinary "superstructure." Yet it was a life which, enflamed and consumed by the thirst of loving her God, demonstrates once again that God is not reached by the intellect, but by love. The function of Teresa Margaret in the history of spirituality does not consist in being a "teacher," but a "witness." A perfect Carmelite, she was a living testimony of the spirituality of Carmel. In fact, her devotion to the Heart of Jesus explains all the aspects of her spiritual and religious life. Her spiritual director tells us how the saint considered the Sacred Heart as the "center of love by which the Divine Word, even when in the bosom of the Father, has loved us throughout all eternity, and with which He has in time merited so that we, with the same shared love, can love Him in return on earth and in Heaven." This devotion also succeeded in rooting Teresa Margaret in her contemplative vocation. It made her pass from the interior and hidden life of the human soul of Jesus to the experience of the mystery of the Word in the bosom of the Trinity.

A great contemplative grace, received on one of the Sundays after Pentecost in 1767, allowed her to penetrate the text of St. John: "God is charity." It had given a decisive thrust to her understanding and living out the richness of the Trinitarian inhabitation in the soul. It was also her devotion to the Sacred Heart—understood as a "rendering of love for love" and deepened by the grace of the truth, "God is charity"—that became the precious instrument of God in her consummation.

The efficacy of her fraternal charity made her the humble servant, not only of the sick—she was infirmarian almost continuously—but also of all the religious. She was always ready, loveable, and forgetful of self, most willing to take on the most fatiguing tasks of the community. She worked with a constant smile, which hid her suffering and fatigue, and was a silent invitation to turn to her for any act of charity whatever. This concrete way in which Teresa Margaret reacted to the mysterious suffering that consumed her—this dedicating herself to the needs of the other nuns as the proof of her insatiable need for loving the Lord—was the final word of her witness. It is the way of all the saints: those who arrive at the perfection of the love of God actualize its consummation in the fullness of fraternal charity.

Novena to St. Therese with Fr. Donald Kinney, OCD

During this 100th anniversary year of our Parish, the Novena to St. Therese (September 22-30) and her feast day on October 1 will be especially joyful. We have invited Fr. Donald Kinney, OCD, to offer the Mass and preach each evening. He owes his vocation to St. Therese. He was ordained here on October 1, 1988. Fr. Donald is now assigned at the Carmelite House of Prayer in Oakville, in the Napa Valley.



Also during the Novena, Fr. Donald will be promoting the visit of the reliquary of St. Therese. It will be coming to Alhambra and our Parish from October 11 to 13, 2025. The year 2025 is also the 100th anniversary of the Canonization of St. Therese and a Jubilee Year in the entire Church.

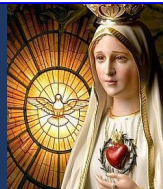

THREE FATIMA SEERS

Ven. Sr. Maria Lucia of Jesus and of the Immaculate Heart (March 28, 1907 – February 13, 2005)



In 1917, Lucia Dos Santos was sent with her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Matos, to shepherd the sheep as usual. It was then that they received the visit of the Virgin in Cova de Iria. The Virgin told Francisco and Jacinta that they would go to Heaven soon, but Lucia was to stay on earth to propagate Her messages. This is precisely what happened. Lucia entered the Sisters of St. Dorothy in 1921 and was with them in Tui and Pontevedra, Spain. In both cities she had important visits from Jesus and Mary. She received the Promises of the First Saturdays, the Vision of the Blessed Trinity, and the petition to consecrate Russia in 1929. In 1946 she returned to Portugal, and two years later entered the Carmel of St. Teresa in Coimbra, where she professed her vows as a Carmelite in 1949. Pope Francis declared her "venerable" on June 22, 2023.



Sr. Lucia wrote two volumes of her "Memoirs" and the "The Callings of the Fatima Messages." She died on February 13th, 2005, in her dear Carmel, where many believe that our Lady still visited her and where Pope John Paul II also visited.

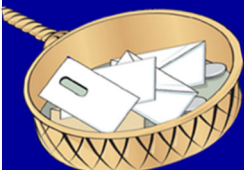
Want to Coordinate the Annual Women's Retreat?

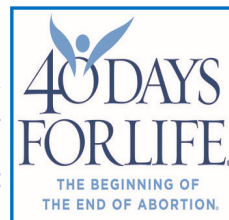

TODAY'S SCRIPTURES: Living Faith from the Heart

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the importance of aligning our hearts with God's commandments and living out our faith with integrity. In Deuteronomy, Moses emphasizes the significance of obeying God's statutes, not merely as rules to be followed, but as a way of life that reflects wisdom and understanding. The Psalmist echoes this by describing the righteous person as one who "walks blamelessly" and "speaks truth from the heart," highlighting the fact that true faith is seen in actions that honor God and show love to our neighbor. This message is reinforced by St. James, who reminds us that every good gift comes from God and that we are called to be doers of the word, not just hearers. Religion that is pure and undefiled, he says, is one that cares for the vulnerable and keeps oneself unstained by the world.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus challenges us to look beyond mere external observances of religious practices and instead focus on the condition of our hearts. The Pharisees are criticized for prioritizing human traditions over God's commandments, revealing that true defilement comes not from outside, but from within—from the thoughts and intentions of our hearts. Jesus calls us to a deeper righteousness, one that is rooted in the purity of our intentions and the sincerity of our love for God and others. As we reflect on these Scriptures, let us ask God for the grace to live our faith authentically, allowing His word to transform our hearts and guide our actions in all that we do.

"LET ME INTRODUCE YOU..." By Fr. Stephen F. Watson OCD



A couple of Sundays ago, I greeted a young father pushing a stroller with a baby and two other children in tow as they walked across our parking lot. "Where are you headed," I asked. "We're going to the Happy Donut." Not having been there myself, I was curious where this place was. Who does not like donuts? I looked up its location for this story. With three children, it would have been at least a fifteen-minute walk from St. Therese. Always on the look out for a family to interview, I asked the father his name and whether he and his wife would be open to having their story in the bulletin. This is the story of the **John and Jennifer Rueda** family.

When I asked John where he was from, he said Pittsburgh. Turns out that is not the only place the Rueda family lived. Let us just say he is from "back east." John's father is from Quito, Ecuador. He received his medical degree from the medical school of the University of Navarra in Pamplona, Spain. This university is the flagship school of Opus Dei, of which John's father is a member. Dr. Rueda came to the United States as a visiting doctor for a hospital in Ohio, where he met John's mother, who was an X-ray technician.

John is one of their nine children.

Jennifer Cadena is a first-generation Colombian who grew up in Chino Hills. After her parents separated when she was young, she moved to Colombia with her mom. After six years, she returned to the States to live with her dad in Irvine, California, where she graduated from Northwood High School. John went to the University of Dallas and Jennifer went to Cal State Fullerton. So, how did they meet? After college John went to the University of Navarra and earned a master's degree in audio-visual studies. After working for a year in Madrid for a reality show, he moved to—that's right!—L.A. Meanwhile, with a degree in public relations and—being an aspiring actress—Jennifer moved to Hollywood. A mutual friend introduced them. Fourteen months later, John and Jennifer were married on July 21, 2017, at Holy Trinity in Atwater Village. (Bishop Cantwell originally wanted the Irish Discalced Carmelites to establish a parish in the Atwater/Tropico area of Glendale. Holy Trinity Parish was established in 1925.)

John and Jennifer bought a house on Story Place three years ago. They now have three children: Blaise, Frances, and Montserrat, whom Jennifer home schools. With her friends, Jenna De Partee and Erin Coleman, Jennifer started *Zelie's Circle*, a group for mothers with young children. There are now thirty moms in the group. *Zelie's Circle* meets every Thursday at Story Park to pray the Rosary for children and priests. Recently, Jennifer hosted a mom's night at her house.

Within days of his arrival in Los Angeles, John was hired by the Archdiocese to produce short documentaries and promotion videos. Today he has his own production company. He still does work for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, and he has also done work for the Archdiocese of Boston. Jennifer, who did become an actress, is in a Disney film, *The Wingwalker*, to be released in October. She also does voice overs. Recently, the Ruedas spent seven weeks in Spain because Jennifer was directing a short film for Bosco Films, a production company based in Madrid. The film is based on a short story by Hemingway, *Hills Like White Elephants*.

Jennifer started coming to St. Therese Church about fifteen years ago. Although she made her First Holy Communion as a child, she did not consider herself a practicing Catholic. That changed after she made a retreat at El Carmelo Retreat House in Redlands in 2008. (See the notice in this bulletin seeking a coordinator for the annual women's retreat at El Carmelo.) She says the retreat was a pivotal experience in her "reversion" to the practice of the Faith. The next year she went to the Holy Land with the then newly-ordained Fr. Robert Barcelos. After three years living in the Parish, the Ruedas have become good friends with other young parishioners. Their Mass of choice is the 11:00 a.m. Mass. They are also associated with Opus Dei, as are a handful of other St. Therese parishioners.

The Rueda family is one of the new, young families of our Parish who bring new life to this hundred-year-old faith community.

The Rueda Family is part of the rich 100-year history of St. Therese Parish.
Let us all walk with St. Therese as we journey together in faith during our Centennial year.

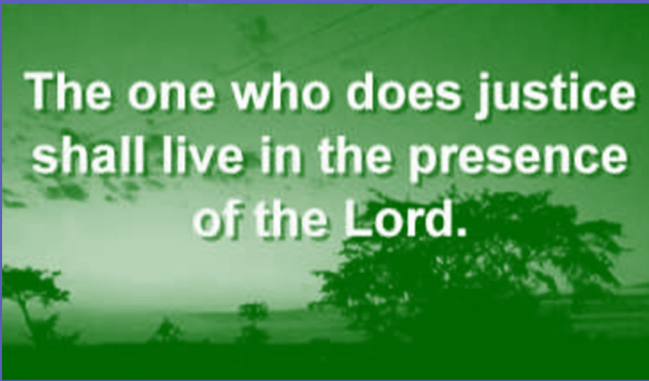
