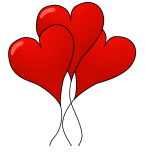

indeed – really; truly

surely – firmly; steadily

gasp – the act or sound of drawing in air suddenly

wilted – became limp; drooped

wringing – clasping, pressing, or twisting the hands together

plaza – a public square or open space in a city or town

sighed – made a long, deep breathing sound due to sadness or relief

well – a deep hole for getting water from the ground

simmer – to cook at or just below the boiling point

seasoning – something that is used to bring out the flavor of the food
