Agent Service Agreement

Service Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2014, by and between Greenville School District hereinafter referred to as "Client" and State Security and Investigation Services, Inc., hereinafter referred to as "State Security".

WHEREAS, State Security possesses expertise in the field of security services, which includes, the training, hiring, retention and deployment of security agents; and

WHEREAS, Client desires to engage State Security, and State Security accepts the engagement, to provide security agents on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of, and for the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. TERM. State Security shall provide Uniformed Security and Consulting Services as described herein for the Client at 9 Donation Road Greenville, PA hereinafter referred to as "Client Property" for a period beginning ~~August 1, 2014~~ July 1, 2014 at 12:01AM and terminating on ~~June 30, 2014~~ June 30, 2015 at 11:59PM.
2. EXCLUSIVE USE. During the term of this contract the Client agrees to use State Security exclusively, and State Security agrees to furnish such number of uniformed Agents as stated in the Contract Schedule, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The terms exclusive, exclusively, exclusive use within this paragraph shall only apply to the employment, in any capacity, directly or indirectly, of any individual, company, or partnership as defined by The Private Detective Act of 1953, 22 Pa. C.S.A. Client's hiring of any other individual, company or partnership as defined the Private Detective Act, other than State Security, will be considered a material breach of this Agreement. Client understands that Agent hours may be varied to meet Client requirements, but will not vary materially from the hours outlined in the Contract Schedule. Should a condition arise which calls for a substantial increase in the number of guards normally used, State Security shall have a reasonable time in which to provide additional Agents at an additional cost.
3. COMPENSATION. For services performed under this Service Agreement, the Client agrees to pay the following amount:

\$14.00 PER HOUR PER SECURITY AGENT

\$15.00 PER HOUR PER SUPERVISORY SECURITY AGENT

In the event a Security Agent is subpoenaed to appear before a Court of law in any jurisdiction for any matter that involves an incident that occurred during their shift at Client Property SSIS would bill directly for this time. The hourly rate for a Security Agent to appear in court is \$20.00 with a minimum of (4) four hours charged plus any parking fees.

4. PAYMENT. Client agrees to make payment fifteen (15) days after receipt of invoice for said services. State Security will prepare and forward an invoice to the address listed in Paragraph 22 NOTICE. Invoices not paid after thirty (30) days will be assessed a 1.75% late charge.

5. **DUTIES.** The number of Agents, Agent posts, as well as the locations, hours, and nature of Agents' duties may vary from time to time to meet the Client's requirements. The method and means of carrying out the Client's objectives shall be within the sole discretion of State Security.
6. **HIRING OF AGENTS.** State Security represents that it has conducted an investigation into each of its Agents prior to employment, including a criminal background check, and each Agent shall adequately be prepared to meet the demands of this contract. State Security shall provide copies of child abuse clearances that are no more than one (1) year old. State Security agrees not to employ any Agent without the Client's approval. State Security Agents will be trained with mandatory child abuse recognition training.
7. **SUPERVISION OF AGENTS.** State Security Agents shall perform such services as the Client shall require, but they shall be employees of State Security. State Security maintains the sole responsibility of hiring, training, uniforming, equipping, supervising, directing, and discharging of all Agents. The Client, however, after consultation with State Security, may request, in writing, that State Security remove any Agent from Client's premises any time Client desires and for any reason not contrary to state or federal law. A violation of this provision may be considered a material breach of this Agreement.
8. **INSURANCE.** State Security shall purchase and maintain insurance in \$1million/\$3million/\$5 million amounts during the period of this contract, which shall provide protection from claims arising from its services for the Client. Said insurance shall include comprehensive general liability insurance and workers compensation to the extent required by appropriate state statutes. Certifications of Insurance evidencing the same shall provide upon request. Client understands that State Security cannot obtain insurance for all risks, and Client is advised to obtain its own insurance coverage.
9. **INDEMNIFICATION.** Client shall hold indemnify and hold harmless State Security and its officers, agents, and employees, against all losses, claims, liabilities, damages, and expenses of any nature directly or indirectly arising out of or as the result of any negligent act or omission by State Security in the performance of this Agreement.
10. **WAIVER OF SUBROGATION.** State Security and Client waive all rights of subrogation against each other to the extent of any insurance coverage obtained pursuant to this Agreement, except such rights as the parties may have to the proceeds of such insurance coverage. If any of the policies of insurance require an endorsement to effect this waiver of subrogation, the owners of such policies shall cause them to be so endorsed.
11. **ANNOUNCEMENTS.** The terms of this contract or any announcement made pertaining to the execution of this contract can be made public in the form of media with the express written consent of both State Security and the Client.
12. **REVIEW BY ATTORNEY.** This contract and its provisions are subject to review by any attorney representing State Security and/or the Client.
13. **BREACH OF CONTRACT.** Either party shall have the option to terminate this Agreement at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice in the event of a material breach of any provision of this Agreement which has not been cured within the notice period. This contract may be terminated without further legal claim against either party if both State Security and the Client agree in writing to cease this contract and that each party will indemnify and hold harmless the other party.

14. ATTORNEY FEES. Client agrees that if State Security institutes legal action to enforce any provision of this Agreement, Client will pay the State Security's reasonable attorneys' fees and litigation costs incurred in enforcing this agreement.
15. MODIFICATION. This Agreement may be amended, modified or supplemented only by the written Agreement of the Client and State Security."
16. NON-WAIVER. If State Security fails to insist upon prompt and punctual performance of any part of this contract of any term or condition, or if State Security fails to exercise any right or remedy under the terms of the contract, that such failure will not constitute a waiver of that or any such term, condition, right or remedy, on that or any subsequent condition.
17. SEVERABILITY. In the event that any provision(s) of this Agreement are deemed invalid, unreasonable, or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision(s) shall be stricken from the Agreement or modified so as to render it reasonable, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement or the modified provision as provided above shall continue in full force and effect and be binding upon the parties.
18. AUTHORITY. The parties executing this Agreement represent and warrant to each other that they have the full right, power, capacity, and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement, that they have duly and properly performed all acts required to authorize them to carry out this Agreement and the transactions contemplated by it.
19. CONTROLLING LAW. The validity, interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
20. VENUE AND JURISDICTION. Should a dispute arise under or in relation to this Agreement, jurisdiction over and venue of any suit arising out of this Agreement shall be exclusively in the state and federal courts of Erie County, Pennsylvania.
21. INTEGRATION. This Agreement represents the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes all prior agreements, contracts, understandings, negotiations and other arrangements between the parties.
