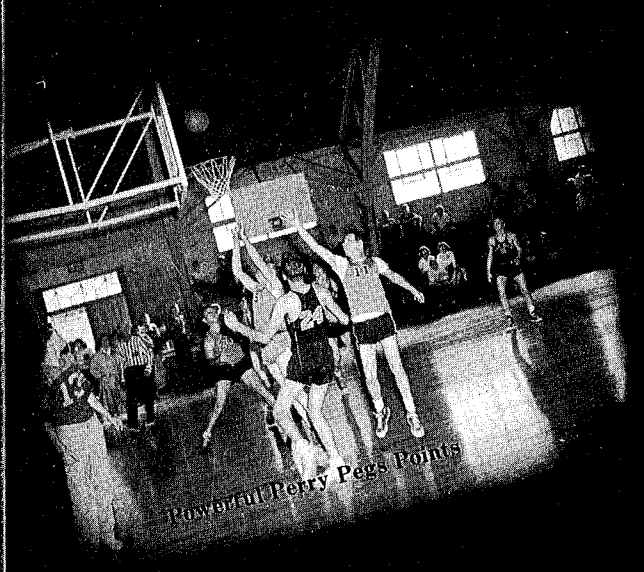


Foreword

It or not, LWHHS and clubs collectively spent approximately \$100,000 last year and will spend the same amount this year. The reason for this is that the seniors filled out a questionnaire concerning the money spent on school activities. From the results of this questionnaire, the following was gained.

Classes
The seniors actually spent \$285 with their play money. This money is spent for their tuition per member and it brought forward \$1,350 by graduation. This will be a major item when the 80 seniors come back by graduation. The remaining money will be applied to their school.

Language Groups
Societas Romana earned \$73 this year. The club members for the school library called "Jabon and the Golden Piece." "Extra" money will be used toward a Latin Club banquet next year.

Spanish Club
The Spanish Club earned \$42 from the Spanish Club. They paid their \$25 pledge for the year and have not decided what to do with the "extra" money. A Spanish Club trip is being planned but the money will not come out of the treasury. Dues are 50 cents a semester.

One club which has no dues is the Library Council. Members earned \$40 this year by having a Book Fair and cupcake sale. Magazines or a book will be bought with the money left over. Ten dollars is given to a Scholarship Fund for a Polk County Library Assistant.

Honor Society members pay 25 cents a semester and earned money by selling concessions at the basketball games. The Society spent \$1 at Christmas for a needy child and expects to spend about \$17 on other projects this year.

The Key Club earned \$150 by selling pep tags and sponsoring several dances. State and national dues, pep tags and hardware supplies for their meetings have cost the Key Club \$102 this year.

The Highlander Band collected \$800 which is being spent on their trip to Washington, D. C. and for some musical instruments. Band members earned money by washing cars, baby sitting and helping in stores. This, along with bake sales and donations helped them to make their trip.

Lake Wales Chorus members pay a dollar a year. Their meetings are held at the home of Mrs. J. H. Draper. The chorus has been successful in obtaining money through contributions from parents, from the LW Music Club, and an anonymous donor bringing the total to \$368. Most of this money will be spent on the new robes.

The 1956 Crown Jewel received pledges from classes of \$600, pledges from clubs \$350, sale of annuals \$107.50 and advertising \$40, totaling \$2075.50. The entire sum will be spent on publishing the annual.
