A financial aid meeting was held in November. Any senior parents who have questions or have never filled out the FAFSA and could not attend the meeting, please contact Sauk's financial aid department for help with the FAF-SA. THE FAFSA IS OPEN NOW!

Even if your student is not attending Sauk, they offer this as a community service because we are in their district. The FAFSA is mandatory for any student attending any sort of post-secondary schooling, this includes tech schools, colleges, and universities.

*For senior parents who have filled out the FAFSA before, please be aware that there are some changes due to the FAFSA Simplification Act.

Seniors should be close to finalizing their college choice. Please let me know where transcripts need to be sent. Even though our transcript includes your SAT/ACT scores, some schools still want official scores sent directly from College Board (SAT) or ACT Corp. You can request your scores online (credit card required) or download a request form available on the internet at the college board website <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> or ACT student website <u>www.act.org</u>. Not sure that you need an 'official' score? Check with the college at which you are applying.

Hopefully, this decision will be made no later than 6:30 a.m. The following radio/TV stations will be given this information:

In case school is dismissed early or it is necessary to delay the running of buses due to inclement weather, you will receive a School Reach phone call and the information will also be posted on the district website and broadcast over the same stations Regardless of the official action to close or not to close, students and parents are urged always to use discretion in deciding whether or not to travel to <u>school</u>.
