Interview of Mr. Johnathan Chandler Principal of C.E. Murray Elementary/Middle School



Q: What should parents expect when their children attend your school this year?

A: Parents should expect their children to be engaged in rigorous instruction every day in a well-managed, family-oriented environment that promotes lifelong learning.

Q: What's one thing that you want parents to know about you as the Principal?

A: I want parents to know that I am committed to ensuring that all students receive a high-quality education every day in a safe learning environment. I am dedicated to collaborating with parents to meet the needs of ALL students. I want them to know that I am willing to go above and beyond to make sure students are successful....academically, behaviorally, socially, and emotionally.

Q: How has the nationwide teacher shortage impacted your school, do you have a fully staffed school?

A: The nationwide teacher shortage has impacted my school. It has been a struggle to find teachers to fill the many vacancies at the school. However, through collaboration with district staff, we were able to fill those positions through programs such as Elevate K12 and Virtual SC.

Q: How would you describe your relationship with your students?

A: My relationship with my students is one of mutual respect. They understand that I care about their education and their overall well-being. However, they also understand that I will hold them accountable for their actions, whether good or bad.

Q: If random students were interviewed from your school what do you think they will say about you as their principal?

A: There are several new things this year starting with the school transitioning from a Middle/High to an Elementary/Middle. Our school will be filled with new faces of students and teachers from GES, and we are happy to welcome them to the C. E. Murray Family. Also, our building has undergone a "facelift", thanks to all the beautiful murals that have been painted throughout the school. Additionally, we will be implementing our house system to help with student behavior, increase morale, and promote positive school culture.
