BLACK HAWK COLLEGE DUAL CREDIT/DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Black Hawk College Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment program enables eligible students who have not yet completed high school to seek an expanded educational challenge. The student enrolls in college classes for the purpose of earning both college and high school credit (Dual Credit), or just college credit (Dual Enrollment).

ELIGIBILITY

- A. For academic classes that transfer to four year universities: This opportunity is available to students who demonstrate strong academic ability based on performance either inside or outside of the classroom. E.g., GPA, test scores, extracurricular activities.
- B. For vocational classes that are part of career certificate or degree programs: This opportunity is available to students who demonstrate strong interest and readiness for vocational-level coursework.
- C. Dual credit/enrollment opportunities are typically limited to high school students in their junior or senior year. Exceptions are available for gifted/accelerated students. Contact your Black Hawk College Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment Coordinator for information.
- D. All course prerequisites as identified in the Black Hawk College Catalog or Schedule of Classes must be satisfied prior to enrollment.
- E. Students must obtain recommendation and approval to enroll from their high school counselor or principal.
- F. Students under 18 years of age must obtain their parent/guardian's approval to participate.

ADMISSIONS & REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

1. Student and school counselor meet to determine his/her readiness for college-level classes.
2. Student completes the Dual Enrollment Application for Admission to Black Hawk College @ www.bhc.edu/application.
3. Student may take the Accuplacer, ALEKS OR use qualifying ACT/SAT scores for placement in English, Reading, and Mathematics classes. Call the East Campus Advising Center at 309.854.1709 for testing schedules, to make an appointment to test, or to receive qualifying ACT/SAT score information. Go to Accuplacer.org for information on what to study prior to taking the Accuplacer Next Gen placement test.
4. Student completes the High School Registration Form and returns it to the high school counselor. Registration forms for students under the age of 18 will require a parent/guardian signature in order to be processed. Dual students are prevented from registering for classes using the online registration system.
5. The High School Counselor will send completed Dual Credit Registration Forms to the Dual Enrollment Coordinator.
6. Student or his/her parent/guardian pays tuition and/or fees if required. Talk to the High School Counselor about billing structure. Account information can be located by logging in to myBHC and click the "My Student Billing" tile.
7. Student purchases required textbooks at the BHC Bookstore OR acquires them through his/her high school. *Books and materials for online classes need to be purchased from the campus where the instructor is based. (If unsure, contact your Counselor or Dual Credit Coordinator.)
8. **Home School Students:** Follow same procedure as above except parent completes form as school official.

WITHDRAWAL FROM A COURSE:

Students receiving dual credit must check with their high school counselor prior to withdrawal from a dual credit class. The BHC withdrawal policy applies to the student's permanent college transcript and refund of tuition if applicable. Please refer to www.bhc.edu/refund or the current published Schedule of College Credit Classes for refund information.

If a student withdraws from a class after the 100% refund period (first week of the term) a 'W' grade will appear on his/her permanent college transcript. The 'W' means withdrawal and does not affect the student's GPA; **however, it may impact future financial aid eligibility.**

If a student does not officially withdraw from a course by filing the Add/Drop Form with BHC, he/she may receive an 'F' in the class.

ALL COURSES for which the student is enrolled on the first day of the term REMAIN ON THE STUDENT'S PERMANENT COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT. FINAL GRADES and/or WITHDRAWALS are also included on the student's transcript.

COST OF COURSES

For classes taught by Black Hawk College Faculty, full tuition and fees are charged at the 2025-26 Black Hawk College rates (\$174/ credit hour). Refer to www.bhc.edu or the published class schedule for current rates. Students will be charged \$30 per credit hour for classes taught on the high school campus by qualified high school district teachers.

Gas Metal Arc Welding Certificate Code: 5866

NOTE: This program is not financial aid eligible.

Students completing the proposed Gas Metal Arc Welding certificate will demonstrate production methods and techniques in gas metal arc welding including spray transfer, short arc transfer and cored wires. Machine set-up, gun handling, weld size, gun angle, wire feed and gas quantities will be learned with an emphasis on safety. Experience will be gained in the flat, horizontal, and vertical positions using various joint designs, fillet sizes, and material thickness. Students will weld with consumable wire electrodes and learn three methods of metal transfer. Students will learn how to properly set up a machine and weld in various positions with ferrous and non-ferrous material and how to regulate oxygen and acetylene for the oxyacetylene welding process. Students will also use math to read welding blueprints, and interpret welding symbols, gauges, and inspection techniques.
