

Frequently Asked Questions

What do I do if I ...

1. HAVE BEEN ABSENT?

- You must bring a copy of a doctor/parent note to the HCCA attendance clerk to change an unexcused absence to an excused absence.
- You must also let the attendance clerk at HCCA know if you missed a class due to a non-instructional absence at your home school such as a fieldtrip or sports event.

2. WANT TO DRIVE TO HCCA?

HCCA Transportation Policy

Students are not allowed to drive to HCCA unless they are granted permission by Dr.
 Johnson, Dr. Wallace, or their home school Assistant Principal-CTAE Supervisor.

Reasons for Requesting Permission to Drive

- Students who are leaving HCCA to go directly to their Dual Enrollment class on the college campus are granted permission to drive.
- Students who are coming directly from their Dual Enrollment class on the college campus are granted permission to drive.

How to Request Permission to Drive

- Students must stop by the front office to pick up a request form.
- Bring signed forms and a copy of their high school and college schedule back to the
 office for Dr. Johnson to review.

What to do if you are running late or miss the bus

- Students must contact their home school Assistant Principal-CTAE Supervisor for permission to drive to HCCA for that day only.
- The home school Assistant Principal-CTAE Supervisor will call Dr. Johnson or Dr. Wallace to let them know they have granted permission for you to drive that day only.

3. DON'T UNDERSTAND THE AO/TESTING SCHEDULE?

- HCCA does not always follow the same AO/Testing schedule that your home school follows.
- Please make sure you ask your HCCA teacher or home school Assistant Principal-CTAE Supervisor if you are uncertain of the schedule for your classes at HCCA during AO or testing.

4. WANT TO HAVE MY SCHEDULE CHANGED?

• You must speak to your home school counselor to make any changes to your schedule. HCCA does not make schedule changes for students.

5. AM TARDY TO SCHOOL?

- Students are considered tardy to school if they arrive to class after morning announcements have been made.
- If a student arrives late to their class, he or she will report to the front office and check in with the attendance clerk and receive an admit slip to their class.

6. NEED TO SEE MY HCCA GRADES ON INFINITE CAMPUS?

 To see your HCCA grades on IC, you must use the drop-down menu located where your school is listed and select HCCA.

7. NEED TO LEAVE SCHOOL EARLY?

- Any student who needs an early dismissal should check out in the front office with the attendance clerk.
- Any student who leaves campus for any reason without following appropriate check-out procedures will be subjected to disciplinary action.
- This rule applies even if you leave before 1st block starts.

8. NEED TO USE THE PHONE?

- Office phones are available but can only be used with the permission of office personnel.
- In compliance with local policy JCDAF, students are permitted to possess cell phones and other electronic devices while on school premises, but these devices are only allowed to be used for instructional purposes as directed by and under the supervision of staff members.
- Recreational use of these devices is not permitted during the school day.
