RANDOLPH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION Regular Monthly Meeting Monday, February 19, 2018 Minutes

On Monday, February 19, 2018 at 6:30 p.m., the Randolph County Board of Education met for their regular monthly Board of Education meeting in the Central Services Board Room at the 2222-C S. Open Session

Call to Order

Chairman Cook called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.
