

<p><u>TK and Kindergarten</u> Mrs. Tinnin</p> <p>Kindergarten students are currently learning high-frequency "tricky words," including <i>the, of, all, and a</i>. In the previous unit, students practiced answering questions orally using complete sentences. In this unit, they will begin writing their responses in complete sentences. As they read longer stories, they will also continue to expand their vocabulary.</p> <p>In math, Kindergarten students are developing their understanding of addition and subtraction using visual models. They are writing number sentences and creating number bonds to represent pictures.</p> <p>TK students are learning to write numbers 0–5. They just completed the unit on woodland habitats and will now begin learning about pond habitats and the animals that live there. In addition, they have been practicing letter sounds and sound-symbol relationships for the letters M, A, T, D, E, and O.</p> <p>Our 100th Day of School was filled with engaging and enjoyable activities for both TK and Kindergarten students. It has been exciting to reflect on and celebrate the tremendous growth everyone has made so far this year.</p>	<p><u>First and Second Grade Explorers</u> Mrs. Mittge</p> <p>Exciting times as always in this busy little world of learners!</p> <p>First grade students are using related facts to solve addition and subtraction problems. Second graders should know how to add and subtract 3-digit equations with and without regrouping. Do a few practice problems with your kiddo to see how they tackle problems.</p> <p>Also, listen to your child read aloud. First graders should be reading 29-50 words per minute. Second graders should be reading 84-130 words per minute.</p> <p>We will release our salmon on Wednesday, February 18th. We will leave the school at 8:35 am and release the fish into Olequa Creek. Students should wear rubber boots and a warm coat.</p> <p>Also, next Friday we will have Stone Soup! Grandparents are welcome to attend. Grandparents who wished to eat some yummy soup with the kids, please arrive at 11:55.</p>
