<u>Deb Cross:</u> Special Education staff serves 49 students and hosts parent meetings and trainings as scheduled. All reports and school improvement plans are submitted as required. Staff will be attending the SD Exceptional Education Conference in March.

<u>James Bagwell</u> The middle/high school are working on incentives to improve attendance, preparing for parent teacher conferences, and gathering data for academic and attendance awards for the semester. Student Council is conducting various fundraising activities for the prom and student council trips. They received a grant from the OST Student Council Initiative to aid in these efforts. National Honor Society and National Junior Honor Society are also fundraising and working on various other school-related projects. Staff are reviewing attendance and academic data to identify student who need additional support.

Amelia Black Bear Scott Clifford has provided music presentations to all elementary students. Students did a great job with their Christmas concert and all Christmas gifts were given out, including jackets and boots from Heartbridge of the Carolinas and stockings from NAHA. Candy bags were also distributed with extras taken to the elderly and the Catholic Church. There is still a concern about attendance and having to make referrals to OST Public Safety. There's also a need for computers for the elementary computer room in order for students to complete required testing and other curriculum assignments. Elementary will also implement a 90-minute block scheduling for reading and math beginning with the second semester.

'odi Stoddard The Office of School Improvement and Student Success is conducting Wellness Checks submitted by staff to address specific needs of students. The NYCP program is working with credit recovery students, conducting a FAFSA Parent Night, taking students to a college visit to USD and planning a career fair

to be held in February. Project AWARE is providing Social Emotional Learning classes to all students K-9. Student check-ins and parent communication efforts are also be conducted. AWARE staff are also providing instruction in all high school Lakota classrooms. Middle School and High School staff are holding their weekly BARR (Building Assets/Reducing Risks) meetings while other staff are overseeing the Wolakota Wednesday activities.
