Tawas Area Middle School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Tawas Area Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

According to the data from the 2020-2021 MSTEP and PSAT assessments, Tawas Area Middle School outperformed the state in 5 out of 12 testing areas for grades 5-8. The data also indicates achievement gaps between economically disadvantaged and non-economically disadvantaged students. There are also academic gaps when it comes to students with learning disabilities and those without. Increased social and emotional support such as additional counseling staff and curriculum have been implemented to better prepare students to learn. Increases to technology and software have been provided to all teaching staff to

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ensure that all students are accommodated and help to accelerate student achievement. Professional development for technology, student growth data, instruction, and social-emotional support have also been provided with the purpose of improving instruction, differentiation, and intervention. This professional development helps to address our achievement gaps and will allow us to meet our adjusted proficiency targets that have been established by the state. We are also actively using universal screeners, such as the NWEA test to help us target low achieving students and provide them with the necessary interventions to help them be successful. This data will be important for us to analyze so we can continue to make improvements to all academic instruction across all of our grade levels at Tawas Area Middle School.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Tawas Area Middle School participates in "School of Choice" and welcomes students who accurately complete the process. All pupils enrolled at Tawas Area Schools grades 5th-8th grades are assigned to Tawas Area Middle School.
2. Tawas Area Middle School is continuing to work on our school improvement plan. We have a goal of improving the district and school climate for students K-12. We are using perception data, Skyward discipline referrals, attendance, extracurricular, course, and athletic engagement and participation as benchmarks for the current school year. We continue to monitor our goal and data to help us evaluate our assessments and instructional methods to ensure that we see increases in positive student outcomes.
3. The Tawas Area School District does not currently operate any specialized schools.
4. Tawas Area Middle School Curriculum is aligned to the National Common Core Standards for Math and Language Arts. These standards can be found online at: <http://www.corestandards.org/>. Now that the new Social Studies standards have been adopted, we continue to provide staff with the necessary training and professional development to deliver the content to our

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students. Tawas Area School District is taking the necessary steps to stay current with any changes and to provide any resources and training for staff

to deliver all the content accurately to our students. The Tawas Area Middle School Curriculum provides learning experiences in all areas of language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, health, physical education, computer instruction, and foreign language. We are continually monitoring and updating our curriculum and instructional practices to meet the academic needs of all of our students.
