
Note: Please encourage your child (ren) to walk straight home from school.

Arrival and Dismissal Reminder

School takes in at 8:15 a.m. and dismisses at 3:15 p.m. We begin serving breakfast at 7:35 a.m. and stop serving breakfast at 7:55 a.m. We would like for all of our students to join us for breakfast. Please be sure to get your children to school on time. A parent must come to the office and sign in all students arriving after 8:15 a.m. However, students are not to arrive on campus before 7:35 a.m. Faculty members are not on duty prior to that time. We do not have before or after school care. If your child is dropped off or arrives earlier than 7:35 a.m. and is picked up after 3:30, that is considered neglect and it will be reported to the authorities. In order to minimize the traffic in the halls and to help your children become independent, please drop your students off at the carpool. All walkers must cross at the crossing guard whether an adult is with them or not. If your child is going home in a different way, than usual, please send a note to your child's teacher.

Please do not pick up or drop off any students on Ann St., Douglas St. or in the school's driveway. All students should be dropped off and picked up in the carpool area only. We are also asking that all parents remain in your car in the carpool lane. The teachers will load all cars. This is for your child's safety!

<u>Note</u>: Do not block the drop off lane in the mornings in carpool. Do not move the carpool cones. They have been placed there for safety purposes. Your child should not exit your vehicle until school staff members enter carpool at 7:35AM.
