

First and Second Grade Explorers Mrs. Mittge


Students' swimming skills have improved greatly this week! Thank you, Booster Club, for providing our students with the opportunity to develop these essential skills!

Additionally, students can provide the properties of a reflective surface and how to manipulate the angle of light.
