Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Approval**

Stark County CUSD #100 is participating in federally funded National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs as an approved Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school for the current school year. Under CEP, all students enrolled at this school may participate in the breakfast and lunch program at no charge. Household applications for free and reduced-price meals will not be collected, but alternate income forms may be distributed by the school to collect household income data for other programs that require this information.

Studies have shown that children who are not hungry perform better in school. By providing school meals to all children at no charge, we are hoping to create a better learning environment for our students.
