Navigating the Pandemic

The Frazier School District started the year off with the goal of providing an in-person, face-to-face learning experience for our students throughout the school year. To date, we have experienced success with our approach and have not needed to shift to a remote instructional model due to an outbreak of positive cases. Navigating the pandemic has not been easy and we completely understand the frustration and struggles that occur when you or a family member is quarantined due to exposure or testing positive for COVID-19. As we navigate through this together, please keep an open line of communication between home and your child's school. If they are sick, please do not send them to school. If they test positive for COVID-19, or are considered a close contact and will miss school, please reach out to your child's teacher for assignments or support. Students can email questions, request a zoom session or google meet, or a phone call to help explain or reinforce a subject area in which they need assistance or guidance.

The True Cost of Cyber/ Charter Schools- "Free" is anything but "Free"

What is advertised as a "free" public education is actually costing you hundreds of thousands of local tax dollars per year. Did you know that cyber/charter schools cost our district approximately \$800,000 a year, or approximately 3 mils of collected taxes per school year. The Frazier School District receives on average, \$9,811 in state subsidy per student who attends our district. The average tuition cost (paid 100% by Frazier School District) to attend the "free" cyber /charter school is \$11,490 - \$25,249 per student depending on the level of educational support needed. Parents and guardians are asked to please take part in the survey.



Planning Your Postsecondary Education



Dual Enrollment

Students in Advanced Placement courses have taken advantage of the Dual Enrollment program and have the opportunity to earn at least 37 credits by the end of the 2021 - 22 school year. Students scheduled in courses such as, AP European History, AP American Government, AP Physics, AP English 12, and AP US History can earn college credits by successfully completing the advanced placement course and meeting college requirements. 
The Band Marches in Halloween Parade
