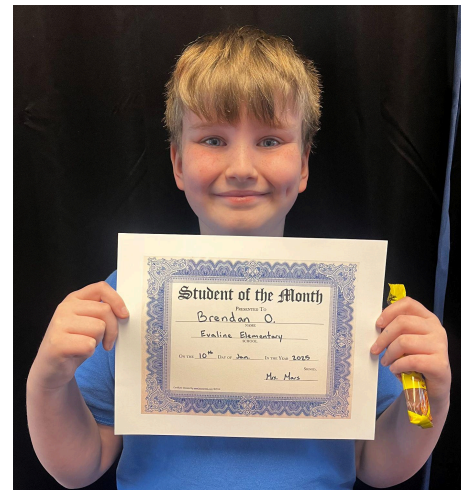


3rd - 6th Grade

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TK and Kindergarten

In math, Kindergarteners finished learning subtraction by using number bonds and finding the missing number. They will start learning teen numbers. TK is learning how to identify and count numbers 6 and 7.

Kindergarteners are learning to read consonant clusters like clap, snap, swim, and step during reading. In this unit, students also start to read little readers that contain short stories. TK students continue their plant unit. They will learn about the parts of a plant and how plants grow. TK is also learning to recognize the beginning sounds of words and the letter A. Both grades continue to work on rhyming and identifying patterns.



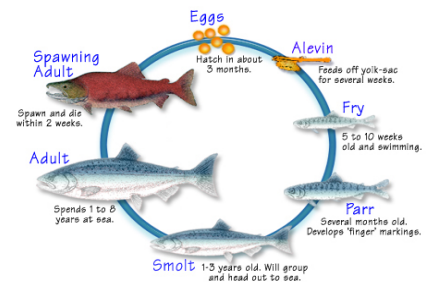
First and Second Grade Explorers

At this point in the year our first and second graders should have 25 AR points or more. Please check the AR reports that are sent home in Boomerang Folders on Mondays to see your child's progress. Spelling lists and reading fluency practice is also sent home in folders on Mondays.

Second grade students should be able to compute sums using a 3-digit addend and 2-digit addend with or without regrouping. First graders should be connecting related facts to addition and subtraction problems. Please work on these skills with your child and/or apply these concepts to story problems.

We are beginning to see changes in our salmon eggs! If we look closely we can see the shape of a fish inside the eggs! Also, some of the babies are beginning to move inside the egg! It is so fun to watch students' excitement as they monitor these changes.

This week students finished their chapters in math and will be testing on Tuesday. 4th graders have been learning about equivalent fractions, simplest form, mixed numbers, and improper fractions. 3rd graders have been working hard on multi-step story problems that involve all four operations. Students in both grades are finding that in general math is easier when they have their multiplication facts memorized. Even a few minutes a night spent on multiplication facts can make a huge difference on your students' success in math.
