Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we return to Ordinary Time for the Sundays (we returned the Sunday evening of Pentecost for the weekdays). This is a time of growth for us, and as we have formally begun the year of Eucharistic Revival, I hope that we can use this time well. I am reminded of a particular breed of bamboo – it takes 5 years from when it is first planted to sprout above the ground, and once it does, it grows so fast you can almost see it, up to a meter (3.28 feet) a day. We need to return to our roots some of which are rotted and decayed and tend to them - and the root for us Catholics reaches into the Eucharist as what nourishes us.

Regarding our Eucharistic Procession at St. Eloi: I am so thankful for the servers, Sisters of Mary Morning Star for organizing the route and the songs/prayers, the ushers, KCs, and all who participated in the procession. It was a beautiful celebration of our faith. As I was carrying the Blessed Sacrament, my prayers went for those experiencing death and tragedy, for our farmers and the crops, for all workers and those struggling to provide, for our families, especially those divided, and for this year to be one of deeper devotion.

This last Friday, June 16, was the Feast of the Sacred Heart. I failed to mention it sooner to give ample preparation, but it is a feast that could provide so much of an antidote to the problems that ail us. First, it is a movable feast – not celebrated on a certain day of the year like Christmas but based on the celebration of Easter – it is the third Friday after Pentecost.

It is a reminder that Jesus Christ took flesh and has compassion on us. It is His Sacred Heart that has mercy on us, and it is a heart of humility. This humility is so needed. It is not proud or conceited but rejoices in truth. The Sacred Heart is offered to everyone – but we too must seek humility and truth to receive it. In this month when so much turns to pride and rejoicing in doing whatever one wants, the Sacred Heart reminds us that God is God, we are His children, and that to find true happiness, we live in conformity with His law. Let us accept the Sacred Heart and live in love and humility.

#### LITURGY MATTERS #32

Communion with one another is an essential part of God's plan; and having designed salvation with this shape, God surely is teaching us and causing us to participate in the tremendous regard He has for us, His tremendous love toward us.

We are made of double communion. Saint Augustine expresses it with utter precision, when he says, "The true peace of rational creatures, which is the only peace of the heavenly city, consists in a perfectly ordered and harmonious enjoyment of God and one another in God."

Enjoyment of God and of one another in God—this enjoyment is already tasted in the Eucharistic feast. Another name for this is praise. There is also a technical term, based on Greek, which is doxology. A sense of doxology or praising and glorifying God has run through the Eucharistic prayer from the very start.

In fact, in the preface and the angelic hymn the notion of doxology was very much to the fore, even if the term was not used yet. But there is a specific part of the Eucharistic prayer that is called the doxology, and it is this that closes the whole prayer. Doxology is this prayer's final thrust, come full circle from the doxology of the preface.

The bishop, or priest, lifts up the bread and wine—bread and wine which we have brought, bread and wine transformed into the body and blood of Christ in the form of his sacrifice which never passes away, bread and wine which we are shortly to consume—and lifting them up he presents them to God the Father as the "perfect offering made to the glory of His name."

"Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." In that moment the Church is doing what Christ did and forever does: she offers his one body, to which she has been joined, to the Father for the glory of His name and for the salvation of the world. This is our communion in the sacrifice of Christ. This is perfect praise.
