

# COVID 19 Preparedness Plan

## Health and Safety Guidelines for JCC Assessment Administrations

Jackson County Central Schools is committed to providing a safe and healthy place for all our students and staff during the administration of assessments, including the ACT.

Jackson County Central Schools has developed the following COVID-19 Preparedness Plan in response to the COVID- 19 Pandemic. School and District Testing Staff Members are all responsible for implementing this plan. Our goal is to mitigate the potential for transmission of COVID-19 in our schools and communities, and that requires full cooperation among our students and staff. Only through this cooperative effort can we establish and maintain the safety and health of all persons in our schools.

The JCC Assessment COVID-19 Preparedness Plan follows the guidance developed by the state of Minnesota, which is based upon Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) guidelines for COVID-19, Minnesota Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MNOSHA) statutes, result and standards, and Minnesota's relevant and current executive orders.

### **Requirements for Examinees (students taking exams)**

- The ACT will be available to all seniors on **October 6th.**
- Examinees should **enter Door 12** (near the gym) **no later than 8:00AM.**
- **Breakfast is available starting at 7:30.**
  - Examinees eating breakfast should still enter Door 12 and go directly to the cafeteria.
  - Examinees will eat at the tables in the cafeteria.
  - Once finished with breakfast, the examinees should go directly to the gym.
  - Examinees must be done with breakfast and be in the gym no later than 8:00.
- Examinees not eating breakfast must **report directly to the Gym** upon entering the building.
- **Upon completion of the exam, “A” day students will report to their classes. “B” day students must exit promptly through door 12** as directed by the testing coordinator.

Examinees, with the support of a parent/guardian, should do a self-screening using the Minnesota Department of Health [Home Screening Tool for COVID- 19 Symptoms](#) prior to arriving on the test administration date. Examinees who respond “yes” to any of the following health screening questions will not participate in the exam:

Health Screening Questions for Examinees
<p>a. Does the examinee have <i>one or more</i> of these symptoms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher</li><li>• Difficulty or trouble breathing</li><li>• New cough or a cough that gets worse</li><li>• New loss of taste or smell</li></ul>

<p>b. Does the examinee have <i>at least two</i> of these symptoms?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sore throat</li> <li>• Nausea</li> <li>• Vomiting</li> <li>• Diarrhea</li> <li>• Chills</li> <li>• Muscle pain</li> <li>• Excessive fatigue (extreme tiredness)</li> <li>• New or severe headache</li> <li>• New nasal congestion or runny nose</li> </ul>
<p>c. Has the examinee been diagnosed with COVID-19 since they last went to their school, child care, or youth program?</p>
<p>d. Has the examinee had close contact (within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes) in the last 14 days with someone diagnosed with COVID-19, or has any health department or doctor or other health care provider contacted you and said your child should stay home (quarantine?)</p>
<p>e. Is the examinee or any other household member who is symptomatic (has symptoms consistent with COVID-19) currently waiting for COVID-19 test results?</p>

If an examinee answers “yes” to any of the above questions, please notify District and/or School Testing Staff that you will not be attending and consult your health care provider for further instructions.

**In most instances, a makeup date for testing has been scheduled. Examinees who cannot attend will be able to reschedule the testing.**

Hand-sanitizer dispensers (that use sanitizers of greater than 60% alcohol) will be available in the testing room.

Examinees will wear masks on test day. Masks must be worn during the entire exam.

Examinees must adhere to physical distancing practices (remain six feet apart) through the test.

**Again, no loitering in the building or visiting with students or staff will be permitted.**

Examinees and testing staff will be alert to signage, markings, and instructions that will address the physical distance and flow of traffic.

Additionally, examinees should contact Jackson County Central staff if they’ve been diagnosed with COVID-19 within 48 hours of taking the exam.

## **Requirements for District and School Testing Staff (staff proctoring the exams)**

District and School Testing Staff Members have been informed of and encouraged to self-monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID-19. Staff do a self-screening using the Minnesota Department of Health [COVID-19 Decision Tree for People in Schools](#) prior to supporting testing each day. If a staff member who responds “yes” to any of the following health screening questions will not support the test administration:

f.	Does the testing staff have <i>one or more</i> of these symptoms: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher</li><li>● Difficulty or trouble breathing</li><li>● New cough or a cough that gets worse</li><li>● New loss of taste or smell</li></ul>
g.	Does the testing staff have <i>at least two</i> of these symptoms? <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Sore throat</li><li>● Nausea</li><li>● Vomiting</li><li>● Diarrhea</li><li>● Chills</li><li>● Muscle pain</li><li>● Excessive fatigue (extreme tiredness)</li><li>● New or severe headache</li><li>● New nasal congestion or runny nose</li></ul>
h.	Has the testing staff been diagnosed with COVID-19 since they last worked with students?
i.	Has the testing staff had close contact (within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes) in the last 14 days with someone diagnosed with COVID-19, or has any health department or doctor or other health care provider contacted you and said your child should stay home (quarantine?)
j.	Is the testing staff or any other household member who is symptomatic (has symptoms consistent with COVID-19) currently waiting for COVID-19 test results?

Physical distancing of at least six feet will be implemented and maintained between district and school testing staff and students. Examinees and testing staff will be alert to signage, markings, and instructions that will address the physical distance and flow of traffic.

District and School staff members will wear masks and/or shields on test day. Basic infection prevention measures are being implemented at the school at all times. District and School testing staff are instructed to wash their hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water frequently throughout the day, but especially at the beginning and end of a testing session, prior to and after meals, and after using the restroom.

Regular practices of cleaning and disinfecting have been implemented, including a schedule for routine cleaning and disinfecting of the testing room, equipment, tools and areas in the work environment including restrooms, drop-off and pick-up locations. Frequent cleaning and disinfecting is being conducted of high touch areas, including keyboards, door handles, etc.

Appropriate and effective cleaning and disinfecting supplies will be available for use in accordance with product labels, safety data sheets and manufacturer specifications and are being used with required personal protective equipment for the product.

The maximum amount of fresh air is being brought into the school, air recirculation is being limited, and ventilation systems are being properly used and maintained. Steps are also being taken to minimize air flow blowing across people.

### **Communication Practices**

This COVID-19 Preparedness Plan was communicated to all district and school testing staff and necessary training was provided. Additional communication and training will be on going.

This COVID-19 Preparedness Plan was made available to all examinees and their families ahead of testing through email communications. It is also posted on the Jackson County Central Website.
