- Class sizes in elementary school average 22 students per class to allow teachers to deliver personalized instruction.




Innovation

Special care is taken to assist with transitions such as bus loading and unloading, lunchtime, and recess to ensure the safety and happiness of our students. Safety and security are our number one priority. Secured entrances, school resource officers, and school nurses at every school support our commitment to safety, security, health, and wellness.

School Bus Ride, Trojan Pride

We offer a school bus orientation event specifically for kindergarten students prior to the first day of school. Be on the lookout this summer for event details where you can ride the bus with your kindergartener and meet the Owosso Public Schools team members. If your child needs transportation, you will register on our website this summer. Our transportation director will reach out to you and get you set up with our My Ride K-12 app to access your student's bus information. Using this mobile app, you can see the approximate location of the bus on its route, access your student's bus number, driver's name, bus stops, and pick-up & drop-off times. Owosso Public Schools' transportation department can send notifications through the app about any changes that may impact your student's route. Parents report loving this technology!

In the 2025-2026 school year, all Owosso elementary school students received FREE school breakfast and lunch through a federal grant. We anticipate that this will continue for the upcoming school year. Kindergarten students are given more time for lunch and recess and have the option of ordering hot lunch or bringing lunch from home. While eating lunch, staff members are readily available to assist students with their meals and prepare them for outdoor recess. Students enjoy physical activity and social interaction with friends on our playgrounds, which are monitored by our caring and experienced staff.

Bus Transportation Information for Kindergarteners

- Owosso Public Schools offers a school bus orientation event specifically for kindergarten students prior to the first day of school. This summer, be on the lookout for event details where you can ride the bus with your kindergartener and meet the Owosso Public Schools team members.
- If your child needs transportation, you will register on our website this summer at www.owosso.k12.mi.us. After you register for bus transportation, you will receive an email from our Transportation Director, Mr. Steve DeLong, with information about the transportation app, **My Ride K-12**, and the details you will need to successfully sign up for the app. This app provides access to real-time data, ensuring your child is in the right place at the right time and allows you to see the approximate location of the bus on its route, access your student's bus number, driver's name, bus stops, and pick-up & drop-off times. Our transportation department can send notifications via the app about any changes that may impact your student's route.
- Bus passes and tags will be available at your elementary school's open house in August or on the first day of school during orientation. After that, they will be available for pick up at the bus garage.
- Busing for kindergarteners will begin on the **second** day of school. For their safety, your kindergartener **must** use the bus pass swipe card each day to board the bus. If the access card is lost, please contact the transportation department for a replacement.
- Some students may be transported from their home school to another elementary school using a transfer bus. This shuttle system is a safe, efficient way to help students get to the correct school each day.
- **Parents/guardians must be visible** to the bus driver when their child is dropped off from school. If a parent or guardian is not visible, the child will be bused back to the bus garage and staff will contact the child's parent/guardian to pick them up.
- The Transportation Department is open 6-10 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. and ready to help! Call 989-725-7665.



Developmentally Appropriate Kindergarten Facts

- Developmentally appropriate curriculum prepares children for kindergarten.
- Whole group, small groups, and choice activity times are scheduled.

CONSIDER THESE QUESTIONS WHEN DETERMINING WHICH PROGRAM IS BEST FOR YOUR CHILD:

1. Has your child had one or more years in preschool?

If yes, your child will probably adapt well to kindergarten. Most children who are five years old by September 1st go to kindergarten.

2. Do you think your child needs one more year to develop language or social skills?

If so, you may want to consider developmentally appropriate kindergarten.

3. Is your child afraid or overly worried about starting school?

Most children gain confidence and independence at five years of age, whether in kindergarten or developmentally appropriate kindergarten. Our teachers help children adjust to school in nurturing ways.

HOW WILL YOUR CHILD GET TO SCHOOL?

Children may take the bus to developmentally appropriate kindergarten from their home school or be dropped off by a responsible adult. Bus transportation is available to rural areas in the a.m. and p.m.

HOW TO REQUEST DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE KINDERGARTEN

Register your child. Mark the developmentally appropriate kindergarten request box on the Kindergarten Registration Checklist Form and return it, with other required forms, to your home school. Age, assessment results, and space availability are all factors that our educational team considers when placing students in developmentally appropriate kindergarten. You will be notified of your child's placement by mid-June.

Vaccines Required for School Entry in Michigan

Whenever children are in group settings, there is a chance for disease to spread. Parents must follow state vaccine laws in order for their children to attend school. These laws are the minimum standard for preventing disease outbreaks in group settings. The best way to protect children from serious diseases is to follow the [Immunization Recommendations for Michigan](#). When following the recommended schedule children are fully protected and any school vaccination requirements are met.

¹Vaccines should be given at certain ages and at certain times (follow the [Immunization Recommendations for Michigan](#) for the recommended number of doses, correct spacing, and ages); this chart is based on Michigan school immunization requirements. We strongly encourage parents and providers to follow the AAP recommended schedule because school requirements are the minimum for protection. Follow this chart when assessing immunization status for school immunization requirements.² If the child has not received these vaccines, documented immunity/waiver is required. During disease outbreaks, incompletely vaccinated children may be excluded from school. Parents and guardians choosing to decline vaccines must obtain a certified non-medical waiver from a local health department. Read more about waivers at www.michigan.gov/immunize. Kindergarten Waiver Request for 2026-2027 School Year

Student Name: _____

According to Michigan Law, if a child residing in the Owosso Public School district and is not 5 years of age on September 1, 2026 of the school year but will be 5 years of age not later than December 1, 2026 of the school year, the parent or legal guardian of that child may enroll the child in kindergarten for the current school year if the parent or legal guardian notifies the school district in writing that he or she intends to enroll the child in kindergarten. A school district that receives this written notification may make a recommendation to the parent or legal guardian of a child described in this subsection that the child is not ready to enroll in kindergarten due to the child's age or other factors. The parent or legal guardian retains the sole discretion to determine whether or not to enroll the child in kindergarten if the student is 5 years of age not later than December 1, 2026.
