From the Principal

Hello Everyone,

We are excited to see all of our Aggie Achievers tomorrow 10/23/23! We are ready for another exciting week of instruction!

Please check with your child as we sent home papers that tell parents how to sign up to receive information about SGSC's PBIS tool for their individual child. This will keep you connected to your child's behavior at school - all grades. Thanks.

Parents, please speak with your child about the importance of not having their cell phones out at school. I put something in the newsletter related to cell phones last week. Again, this week, we are having issues with cell phones. Our staff deserves the respect to be able to do their jobs without having to worry about students using their cell phones to record them or take pictures of them and use on social media. We are also hearing that this may be happening on the bus as well. Please speak with your child(ren) about the importance of not recording someone without their knowledge. Cell phones can be such an amazing form of technology, but not when it is used in this way. Thank you for helping to resolve this matter.

As the weather begins to cool off and your children are wearing sweaters and jackets, please write their names (first and last) in the outerwear because they will often leave them lying around. This will make it easier to get the items back to their rightful owners instead of ending up in Lost and Found items.

We are having so many Achievers that are being checked out early throughout the week - especially on Fridays. Please remember - EARLY CHECKOUTS ARE DISCOURAGED AFTER 2:30 PM. Early checkouts after 2:30 PM are discouraged due to ongoing instructional practices that include remedial and acceleration opportunities for Achievers. In addition, students are also transitioning to various areas to prepare for dismissal. Please remember that unexcused 5 unexcused tardies and early checkouts will be counted as an absence as well. Although early checkouts are discouraged, we do realize that extenuating circumstances such as doctor's appointments and

family emergencies will occur. We will make every effort to accommodate, but **please do not come to check your child out to simply avoid waiting in the car rider line.**

If you need a change in transportation, you must provide this IN WRITING. This can be through a note sent to school with your child or you can email transportation@sowegastemcharter.org to request the change. These requests should be in place no later than 1:30 pm on the day of the request.

Attendance - We are beginning our new attendance policy this year. The basics from this policy are as follows:

- 5 unexcused absences - you will receive a letter and attend a conference about attendance
- 7 unexcused absences - you will receive a letter with a reminder that your child can only miss 3 more days before he/she may be withdrawn from the school
- 10 unexcused absences - your child may be withdrawn from Southwest Georgia STEM Charter School

Reminders:

- If your child is absent, he/she will have 3 days to bring in their excuse after returning to school
- You may write up to 3 parent notes during the school year
- Your child will have 3 days to make up any missing assignments while he/she was absent from school

Provide distinguished and integrated instruction in an environment that cultivates respect, is inclusive of all, and lays the foundation for excellence and life-long learning.



Students are not permitted to use cellular phones during school hours.

Cell phones should be turned off upon school arrival and students should store cell phones in their locker or bookbag upon arriving to homeroom. Cell phones may not be kept in clothing pockets.

- Phones must be turned off at all times while in the school building. If a phone rings during class, the teacher will revoke the Cell Phone Use Policy. "Forgetting" to turn off the phone is not an excuse.
- Use of a cell phone during a test will be considered cheating and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken.
- Students are prohibited from using a cell phone to take photographs or record video at any time on school property. This includes taking photographs or video recordings in restrooms, locker room areas, etc.
- If a student violates the Cell Phone Use Policy, the teacher or school staff member shall confiscate the cell phone and take it to the office.

First offense - the phone is taken away until the end of the day and kept in the front office.

Second offense - the phone must be picked up by a parent or guardian.

Third offense - either the student is assigned to ISS for two days of the phone is taken away for ten school days to be kept at the school (parent's choice).

Additional offenses - all result in the student not being allowed to have a cell phone on school property. Furthermore, students who do not adhere to these guidelines will be subject to other disciplinary actions.

- A student is required to hand over the cell phone and all its individual parts, including but not limited to the battery and memory cards, to a teacher or school staff member when requested. Failure to do so will result in ISS or OSS.
- The student assumes all risks in bringing such cell phones and other electronic devices onto school property or to school related functions.

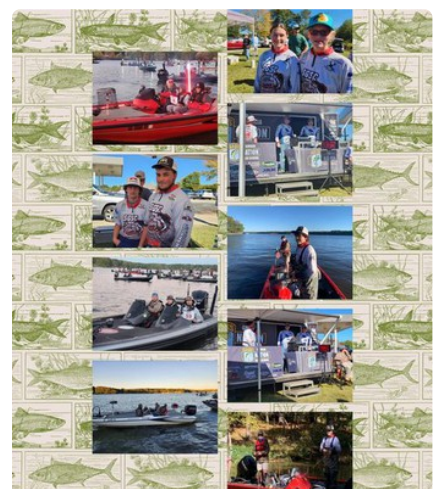
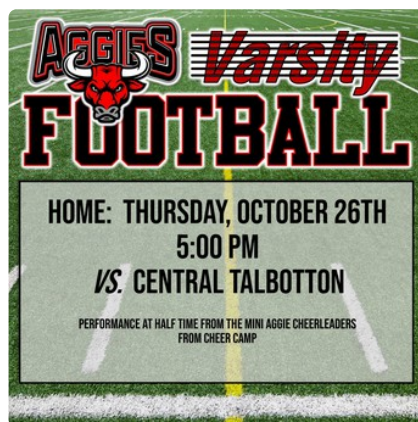
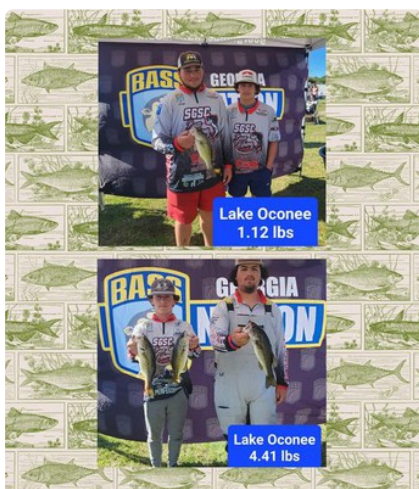
SGSC SPORTS SECTION

How to Talk with Kids about Gratitude





From the MTSS Coordinator



From our MTSS Coordinator...

Homework can be very frustrating. Not only for you, as the parent, but for your child as well. One of the biggest frustrations can be that kids may rush through homework. Kids with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) may rush through theirs as well.

Try these strategies to help slow your child down when doing homework:

1. Designate a set amount of time for homework.
2. Use a timer. Encourage your child to work without stopping until the timer goes off.
3. Help your child get in the right mindset to do work. If your child seems too tired or stressed from the day's events, consider letting homework wait a little while. It's important that your child has more energy to give it their best effort.
4. Step in if your child needs to slow down. Check in with your child, and ask questions. "Are you doing your best work?"
5. Encourage kids to look over their work. Remind your child to check over their work. Create a checklist for your child that includes: Did your child follow directions? Are the words spelled

correctly? Did your child use capitals when appropriate?

6. Help kids break down projects. Create a study calendar that breaks down the project into small daily tasks.
7. Get kids the help they need. If you think your child has learning differences affecting their reading, math, or writing skills, meet with your child's teacher.
8. Remind kids of their strengths. Talk about a time your child worked hard at something - big or small - and succeeded. This will boost your child's confidence.
