




BOARD OF DIRECTORS









Number of Children/Families Served



Average Monthly Attendance




<u>Average Monthly Enrollment Numbers</u>

SCHOOL READINESS ACTIVITIES

Bradford-Tioga Head Start, Inc. is committed to providing all children with a varity of opportunities in preparation for a successful transition to Kindergarten.

Activities Include:

- Trainings to help prepare children and parents for kindergarten
- Development of specific goals with parent input
- Transition meetings for children with special needs
- Visits to kindergarten classrooms and school cafeterias
- School Readiness Plan developed by parents, staff, school and community
- Head Start and Kindergarten teachers visit other classrooms
- Providing on book monthly to each family
- Kindergarten transition packets provided to families

SCHOOL READINESS

In all age groups, gains were made in the areas of cognition and knowledge, language and literacy and social and emotional. For the birth-to-three population, the largest gain was in the Language and Literacy Development area with a 14% gain. In the three-to-five population, the largest gain was in the Cognition and Knowledge area with a 30% gain.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES

Parents participate in classroom and family playgroup activities. They are invited to develop a Family Partnership Agreement where they can set goals for themselves and work with staff to develop Individual Goals for their child. Parents participate in activities and receive training on their child's development, health, and education.

This year's Parent, Family and Community Engagement Outcomes indicate that the area of Families as Lifelong Educators had the highest gain at 28%.

The program saw a decrease in the areas of Families as Learners, and will work to increase numbers in that area.
