Dear Parishioners,

Happy Gaudete Sunday! As we enter this third week, we mark it with joy and wearing of rose vestments. We are over halfway through the Advent season, with Christmas only 10 days away. Perhaps these last few days will be well used for preparing our hearts to receive Christ with deeper devotion and love this Christmas.

Some time ago, I was asked about our bell at St. Edward. Due to past mechanization, the bell (bought in 1913) was inoperable except for tolling, Fred Rabaey sought to get estimates and began a drive to collect money to replace the system. The amount of this project is about \$32,000 and the money has been collected. Thank you to all who contributed, and to Fred.

I sent in the proxy request (the Bishop and Vicar General need to give their vote to enter into a contract). I am relatively certain that this will be approved. We will seek to have this done in the spring or summer. When the renovations of the church are completed, hopefully we will be able to ring a call to worship!

We are beginning the process to look at the needs of the basement cafeteria/social hall of St. Edward. I have reached out to a brother priest for some input as to where to begin.

Related, we have signed the proxy to proceed with the storm windows of St. Eloi. All the funds needed for the project have been collected. We are aware of some repairs needed above in the sanctuary behind the ambo and above where the servers sit. We are seeking someone who repairs plaster and then we can paint. With that, we are nearing the end of needed major repairs at St. Eloi, though in reality, repairs never end.

All these projects are because of both your generosity, and because you recognize that the buildings and grounds require upkeep. Thank you!

REFLECTION ~ Think about this ...

If dying to ourselves in order to worship God at Mass is hard for us, then it is all the more so for children. There are many opinions about what parents should and should not do during the liturgy. Instead of offering a list of dos and don'ts, it may be helpful to reflect on how enriching the Mass can be for little ones.

Although children below the age of reason are not bound to attend Mass like the rest of us, there is much value in taking them while they are little. It is highly beneficial for children to learn early on that the Mass is not a secondary aspect of our lives but the highest way of worshipping and encountering God.

Years of insistence on silence and reverence at Mass will teach them many virtues necessary for encountering him in their daily lives. But this will only occur if they are constantly exposed to the liturgy.

For parents, this entails much work, from explaining to their children what happens at Mass to periodically taking them to the back of the church when things get a bit chaotic. But it also requires a certain level of tolerance from the faithful. If we are only satisfied when things are completely quiet, then we are failing to form the next generation of faithful believers. Let us look kindly at the parents who are trying their best to bring their little ones to Christ.

Let us pray.

Lord, your sufferings bear proof of your infinite love for us. May we learn to treasure the life that you have gained for us through your passion and death and remember our worth by remaining in your presence. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.



The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, the day when we light the pink candle on the Advent wreath (hence the 'pink candle' Sunday). Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near. Gaudete means "rejoice". This day reminds us of the joy that is to come, and serves, amid this season of penance, as a kind of 'break' when we recall the hope we have because of the coming of Our Lord Jesus.
