	relationships. The SEL curriculum materials
	will be utilized to teach weekly lessons to
	students in grade K-8 to better assist students
	in managing relationships, learning habits of
	mind skills, and also working through tough
	situations. The school-wide assemblies will
	reinforce the skills taught during the weekly
	SEL lessons and will focus on how to be
	strong contributing citizens in both a digital
	world and in person. The curriculum and
	assemblies are monitored by our school
	counselor with follow-up and support
	provided by the classroom teacher. In
	addition, these funds help provide students
	with learning opportunities to participate in
	foreign language courses, technology
	supports, and extended learning opportunities
	such as fieldwork and college courses.
