Why do we have seasons?

Autumn is the perfect time to discuss the four seasons, and incorporate a lesson using the globe to show how the earth's axis is tilted. Students see that when our hemisphere is tilted toward the sun, it receives more direct rays to experience summer. The opposite is true when the earth is tilted away, for the winter months, and also makes the days shorter in autumn and winter, as the earth rotates away from the sun.



Closing with an easy autumn pattern worksheet provides some fun in sequencing and practicing predicting events... just like the change in seasons!
