



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese,



Blessed Solemnity of Corpus Christi during this year of Eucharistic Revival in our country! We have the great privilege of being part of two major events on this Feast Day! In the morning, we are hosting 100 pilgrims from Northern California who have been processing with the Blessed Sacrament since May to all the California Missions. **They will join us at our 9:00 a.m. Mass and in the Corpus Christi Procession which will take place immediately after the Mass. We will process on a longer and more visible route than usual, with a Benediction stop at the Carmelite Sisters' chapel. Following Mass, the Knights of Columbus will host a free Pancake Breakfast in the Hall for all the pilgrims and parishioners. Please join us!**


Later in the afternoon, the Archdiocese will host the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at the Cathedral, beginning with a 3:00 p.m. Mass celebrated by the Archbishop, then a one-mile Eucharistic Procession downtown, followed by a celebration on the Cathedral patio. Please take part in this Eucharistic Revival that is reigniting devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament!

Also, I would like to thank all of you who came to pay your respects at the funeral of our beloved maintenance man of 21 years, Mariano, on June 11th, and all who gave a donation in time, talent or treasure toward his funeral or burial. May God reward you for your goodness and generosity and may Mariano rest in peace!

Below is a meditation from Pope St. John Paul II on Corpus Christi. —Fr. Peter Mary, O.C.D.

"Today the Church shows the world the Corpus Christi—the Body of Christ. And She invites us to adore Him: *Venite adoremus! / Come, let us adore Him!* The attention of believers is focused on the Sacrament in which Christ has left Himself: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is the reason for considering it as the holiest reality: 'the Blessed Sacrament,' living memorial of the redeeming Sacrifice.

"In the consecrated Bread and Wine, the same Jesus of the Gospels remains with us: He whom the disciples met and followed, whom they saw crucified and risen, whose wounds Thomas touched, exclaiming prostrate in adoration: 'My Lord and my God!' (John 20:28; cf. ibid., 17-20).




"In the Sacrament of the altar, there are offered for our contemplation the full depths of the mystery of Christ, the Word and the flesh, the divine glory and His tent among men. Before this Sacrament, we are sure that 'God is with us,' that in Jesus Christ He assumed all the dimensions of our human nature, except sin, emptying Himself of His glory to clothe us with it (cf. ibid., 21-23).

"The ecclesial community responds to people in every age who ask perplexed: 'We wish to see Jesus' (John 12:21), by repeating what the Lord did for the disciples of Emmaus: He broke the bread. In the Breaking of the Bread, the eyes of those who seek Him with a sincere heart are opened. In the Eucharist, the intuition of the heart recognizes Jesus and His unmistakable Love lived 'to the end' (John 13:1). And in Him, in that gesture, it recognizes the Face of God!

"On this journey Jesus goes before us, with the gift of Himself to the point of sacrifice and offers Himself to us as nourishment and support. Indeed, He does not cease to repeat to the Pastors of the People of God in all the ages: 'Give them something to eat' (Luke 9:17); break this Bread of Eternal Life for everyone!" A demanding and exalting task—a mission that lasts until the end of time.

"And you, Jesus, Living Bread who gives life with this Bread of Pilgrims, 'may you feed us, may you guard us, may you let us see good things in our homeland eternally.' Amen."

a.m. Mass to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi. They will also join us after Mass for a Corpus Christi Procession, with a stop for Benediction at the Carmelite Sisters' house.

Then the **Knights of Columbus** have graciously offered to host a **F R E E Pancake Breakfast in the Hall** in honor of the pilgrims. You can enjoy this free breakfast after any of the morning Masses (7:30, 9:00, or 11:00 a.m.).



The Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Solemnity of **Corpus Christi**—now officially called The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—is a feast that celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Though the *institution* of the Eucharist is commemorated on Holy Thursday, that day is marked by sorrow as it's the beginning of the Passion of Christ. The Church established this separate feast to joyfully honor the mystery of the Eucharist in a more celebratory way.

The feast was officially established in 1264 by Pope Urban IV, following a Eucharistic miracle in the small town of Bolsena, Italy. A consecrated Host began to bleed onto the corporal cloth, strengthening the Church's teaching on the Real Presence. At the same time, a visionary Belgian nun, St. Juliana of Liège, had been promoting the idea of such a feast. Her visions and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament deeply influenced the Church. The feast also served to counter the growing heresies of the time, particularly doubts surrounding the doctrine of transubstantiation.


Here at St. Therese Church, we are marking this special day with a Corpus Christi procession following the 9:00 a.m. Mass. We are especially blessed to welcome the Camino de California pilgrims, who have been journeying to the California Missions on a Eucharistic pilgrimage in honor of the Jubilee Year. They will join us in processing with the Eucharist through the streets around our church—stopping for Benediction at the convent of the Carmelite Sisters—a beautiful reminder that Christ walks among His people.

The Carmelite Foundress, St. Teresa of Ávila, once wrote, *"If I had understood the grandeur of the Eucharist earlier in life, I would never have wasted a single moment that I could have spent before the Blessed Sacrament."* Let us be reminded today that the Body of Christ is not just a doctrine—it is a Person, our Divine Lord, who remains with us in love.



Mass for the Feast of the Sacred Heart

The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is this **THIS Friday, June 27.** To honor Our Lord on that special day, we will celebrate an **extra Mass that evening at 7:15 p.m.** All are encouraged to attend and unite your hearts to the Heart of Jesus, especially during this time of Eucharistic Revival.

This Feast is a perfect opportunity to renew our love and trust in the One who said, ***“Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love.”***

The entire month of June is traditionally dedicated to Jesus' Sacred Heart—a tradition that gained universal prominence in the 17th century after Jesus appeared in a series of visions to **St. Margaret Mary Alacoque**, a French Visitation nun. Jesus first appeared to her in December of 1673 and continued to do so for 18 months, with other apparitions occurring between 1674 and 1675. The most important apparition took place on June 16, 1675, when He asked for a feast to be established in honor of His Sacred Heart, promising blessings for those who would honor Him in this way. **Other things that Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary (and to all**

who show Him their love and devotion) are:

- **"Be Open to Me":** St Margaret Mary Alacoque was encouraged to be open to Jesus's will and to serve Him as an instrument to draw hearts to His love.
- **"Fear Nothing":** Jesus reassured her that He would reign despite His enemies and those who would oppose Him. He also promised that He would protect and secure her.
- **"A Place of Refuge...":** Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that He was a Place of Refuge where all things would be made easy.
- **"I am Thy Protector and Surety":** Jesus assured her that He was her protector and surety, and that within her soul He had established His reign of peace and—in her heart—His reign of love.
- **"I am Here to Help You":** Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that He would sustain her through the crosses she would bear and that she should always trust in Him, allowing Him to do His will in her.

There will NO CONFESSIONS that Wednesday!




After acceptance, families should return a signed contract and registration fee to the school office within ten business days in order to secure their spot.

National Eucharistic Revival



Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 31:

The Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist

As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states, “The Mass consists in some sense of two parts, namely the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist—these being so closely interconnected that they form but one single act of worship. For in the Mass is spread the table both of God’s Word and of the Body of Christ, and from it the faithful are to be instructed and refreshed” (GIRM, 28, also cf. SC 56, 48, 51).

Pope St. John Paul II reflected on how the unity of the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist goes back to the early Church: “We are well aware that from the earliest times the celebration of the Eucharist has been linked not only with prayer but also with the reading of Sacred Scripture and with singing by the whole assembly. As a result, it has long been possible to apply to the Mass the comparison, made by the Fathers, with the two tables, at which the Church prepares for her children the Word of God and the Eucharist; that is, the bread of the Lord” (Dominicae Cenae, 10). This image of the two tables illustrates for us that we are fed in two main ways through the Mass: through the hearing of God’s Word to us and through the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
