In game 3, Midland fought for a 15-10 victory. The Freshmen team will compete in a tournament in Farmington this weekend and their next league match is Tuesday at Bay City Central.

The Midland High Girls Varsity Volleyball beat Mt. Pleasant 3-1 at home on Thursday night October 3. The Chemics lost set 1, 21-25, won set 2, 25-19, then got on a roll to win set 3, 25-15, and won the match convincingly in set 4, 25-16 with several strong service runs by the team.

Payton Palmer led the offense with 46 assists, 13 digs, 3 kills, 2 aces. Nicole Giardina pounded 22 kills, 9 digs, 2 aces, 2 blocks while teammate Avery Stewart delivered 14 kills, 6 digs. Middle hitters Brooke Russell contributed 5 kills, 5 blocks, 5 digs while Emmalea TerBurgh added 3 kills, 2 blocks. And Lila Rekeweg stepped up big with 7 kills, 9 digs, 2 blocks, 2 aces on the night.

For Defense, Brigid O'Malley dug up 25 balls, served 2 aces; Bella Kroll had 10 digs, Rhyannah Nunamaker added 7 digs.

Many thanks to an amazing Costume Party themed student section, the Midland Chemics are 19-5 overall and 6-2 for second place in the SVL behind Davison.
