From Our Literacy Coach

Distance learning is a challenge for everyone involved. With all of the unknowns, the best way to support your child is to set them up for success. Below are some tips for helping students learn online.

- Create a designated learning space for your child. Give them a distraction free space to work. Make sure they have easy access to all the materials needed for class.
- Post and follow your child's classroom schedule. Check-in to be sure they are attending class and are on task. Create a cue with your child to get back on task, if they become distracted.
- During scheduled breaks, have your child get exercise. This reduces stress and can prevent anxiety. Make sure they get away from all screens.
- Check to see if your child is turning in their work. Use their google classroom(s). Go to the classwork tab. Click on "view your work". Here you will see what is assigned, what is returned, and what is missing.
- Keep open communication. All teachers at WMES have a REMIND account and an e-mail address. When in doubt, reach out!
- Reward efforts. Establish a reward system with your child. Reward them to keep them motivated and remind them of their reward when times get tough.
