STANDARDS

Reading/Writing

- Tell the difference between fiction and nonfiction books.
- Use illustrations and details to describe key ideas.
- Describe how two individuals, events, ideas, or pieces of information in a text are alike or different.
- Identify the main topic and details in a text with use of graphic organizers.

Math

- Subtract multiples of 10 (10-90) using models, drawings, and strategies to justify the answer.
- Add and subtract double digit whole numbers without regrouping.
- can add double digit numbers, with and without regrouping, using models, drawings and strategies to justify the answer (place value, orders of operation, related facts, etc.)

Social Studies

- Explain the importance of patriotic traditions and symbols.

Spelling

- As the year progresses, our spelling words are getting more difficult. Please take time to practice these words at home and talk with your child about the "rules" the words follow.
