Please take time to celebrate your child's progress. By celebrating every step of a child's educational journey we are demonstrating our support and belief in them.




National Coaches Day was celebrated on October 6th! Thank you to all of the amazing coaches at Tri-Township! We appreciate your time and dedication to our students.
