Alabama's Voluntary Pre-K Program

Elmore County Public Schools

- Elmore County Board of Education is accepting online pre-registration applications for the 2025- 2026 school year for Eclectic Elementary, Holtville Elementary, Coosada Elementary, and Wetumpka Elementary Schools. (For assistance with accessing the online application, contact one of the schools or the Board of Education.)
- Enrollment is open to all children four years of age on 9/1/25* who are residents of Elmore County (children who are eligible for kindergarten are not eligible for Pre-K).
- Children may be pre-registered for any/all schools; parent/guardian is responsible for transportation.
- **Enrollees must live in Elmore County**. Only children who live in Elmore County will be included in the drawing.
- Families of selected students will be required to provide the following documents for enrollment in the Pre-K program. Documents are not required prior to the random selection process. Dates and times for enrollment of selected children at each school will be provided at a later date.
 - Home/apartment lease
 - o 2nd proof of residence
 - Child's birth certificate
 - Social Security card
 - Parent/guardian ID
 - Alabama Immunization Certificate
- No child will be denied participation on basis of income, sex, race, color, national origin, or disability.
- There is no registration fee or cost to attend for this program.
