Alabama’s Voluntary Pre-K Program

Elmore County Public Schools

- **Elmore County Board of Education** is accepting online pre-registration applications for the 2025- 2026 school year for **Eclectic Elementary, Holtville Elementary, Coosada Elementary, and Wetumpka Elementary Schools**. (For assistance with accessing the online application, contact one of the schools or the Board of Education.)
- Enrollment is open to all children four years of age on 9/1/25* who are residents of Elmore County (children who are eligible for kindergarten are not eligible for Pre-K).
- Children may be pre-registered for any/all schools; parent/guardian is responsible for transportation.
- **Enrollees must live in Elmore County**. Only children who live in Elmore County will be included in the drawing.
- **Families of selected students will be required to provide the following documents for enrollment in the Pre-K program.** Documents are not required prior to the random selection process. *Dates and times for enrollment of selected children at each school will be provided at a later date.*
 - Home/apartment lease
 - 2nd proof of residence
 - Child’s birth certificate
 - Social Security card
 - Parent/guardian ID
 - Alabama Immunization Certificate
- No child will be denied participation on basis of income, sex, race, color, national origin, or disability.
- There is no registration fee or cost to attend for this program.
