Personal Electronic Device guidelines

The Houston County School District policy JCDAF outlines the access and use of personal electronic devices in pre-kindergarten through eighth grade while on school premises during school hours. Students in grades PK-8 are not permitted to access personal electronic devices while on school premises during school hours from 8:30-3:30, including but not limited to cell phones, smartwatches, tablets, e-readers, headphones, earbuds, and other devices with functionalities such as wireless communication, internet access, messaging, video recording, gaming, social media access, or data transmission during school hours. Any student found in violation of this policy and/or its procedures during the school day shall be subject to progressive discipline consequences as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

Drop off, Visitor, Checkout, and Dismissal Procedures

Student safety is our number one priority at Kings Chapel. We must guarantee that your child will not have contact with unapproved adults and will always be transported home with the correct person every day. We also strive to operate our school in an orderly and efficient manner while placing an emphasis on student learning during the day. Please note the following guidelines that will greatly assist us in accomplishing these goals. Your cooperation is essential and appreciated!

- **Dropping students off at school** – All students should be dropped off **before 8:30** each day. If you arrive after 8:30, your child is tardy to school. You must walk your child into the building and check your child in through the front office. Arriving early is the key to having your child unloaded, in class, and ready to start their day! **Classroom instruction begins promptly at 8:30.**
 - **Car riding students** - Pull to the end of the car rider line for unloading. Students should be ready to unload as soon as they arrive to keep the line moving quickly. Watch carefully for children and adults walking through the parking lot.
 - **Walk up students** – Park in the **SIDE** parking lot and walk with your child all the way to our front porch where they will enter the school. Watch carefully for traffic as you walk your child up each morning.
- **Visiting during the day** – All visitors to school must check in to the front office for a visitor's badge. Between 8:30-3:30, visitors must be “buzzed in” to the building from our vestibule. Parents/guardians will be able to visit classrooms on several designated days throughout the year.
- **Early Dismissal** - All early dismissals must be made prior to **3:00**. After **3:00**, students must be picked up or transported home in the regular fashion. Parents/guardians should be prepared to show a picture ID if picking up a student early from school.
- **Transportation Changes** – Student transportation home (bus, car, walk ups, ASP) is set at the beginning of the year. Any change in the transportation home of a student must be made to the front office prior to **3:00**. Transportation changes should be called into the front office staff. No changes to a student's transportation can be made after **3:00**.
- **Pick Up Cards** – Student specific cards with a three-digit number will be provided to all students and must be used when picking a child up. This year, these cards are bright yellow. Approved individuals picking up students in cars or in walk up must have their cards on display **EACH DAY** for us to make sure our students are being picked up by permitted adults. Those without a yellow pick-up card will be asked to park, report to the front office, and provide a picture ID.
- **Walk up Dismissal** –. Park in the SIDE parking lot and enter the cafeteria just inside the lobby to pick up your child. Individuals picking up a child **MUST** have the school issued pick up card and check them out with staff on duty. Only students who are previously scheduled as walk ups can be picked up in this fashion. Watch carefully for traffic as you walk to and from the side lot. Walk ups must be picked up by 4:00. After 4:00, students will be sent to the front office and must be picked up in the office.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Kings Chapel Elementary values regular attendance to enable the success of all students. Please prioritize having your child at school on time every day.

- Parents are required to provide excuses for absences within 5 school days. Excuses are accepted through email, the HCSD App, or can be handwritten. Excuses should be turned into the front office and should go to Courtney Grantham or can be emailed to courtney.grantham@hcbe.net. Verbal excuses are not accepted.
- Each student is allowed up to ten excused parent notes, within the approved reasons by the Georgia Board of Education. After ten excused parent notes, each absence after these ten will be considered unexcused without doctor documentation. - **3 unexcused absences:** School staff will contact the parents and document the contact. A contact may be an email, phone call, letter, note, or other forms of communication.
- **5 unexcused absences:** Parent will receive a 5-day letter/contract. Parent may request a conference.
- **8 unexcused absences:** A school social worker referral will be made and a call-out or email will go out to the parent.

Tardy/ Early dismissals

- The instructional day is from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm. After 8:30 am students are considered tardy, and a parent is required to sign the student in through the front office. **If your child will be eating breakfast, please ensure that he or she is dropped off early enough to eat breakfast.**
- 8 unexcused tardies/Early Dismissals-Parent Contact
- 10 unexcused tardies/Early Dismissals-Excessive Tardy/Early Dismissal Notification
- 15 unexcused tardies/Early Dismissals-Attendance Contract Meeting scheduled with parents and administration
- 25 unexcused tardies/Early Dismissals-Referral to the HCSD Social Services Department

Positive Behavior Incentives and Supports (PBIS)

At Kings Chapel, we believe that providing simple, clear expectations for student behavior and recognizing students who consistently make good choices is a far stronger management tool than punishments and consequences. We have adopted a set of expectations, PAWS Promise, to help guide students' behavior while at school. Our PAWS Promise is taught to students at the beginning of each year, said aloud over the intercom, and posted throughout the school. Students who follow the PAWS Promise are rewarded in the following ways:

Cougar Cash and the Cougar Store: Stakeholders have "Cougar Cash" to give to students who are consistently following the PAWS Promise. Students save their "Cougar Cash" and use it to purchase items from the Cougar Store.

Principal Parties: At the end of the nine weeks grading period, students have an opportunity to attend the "Principal Party" during their specials time. To attend, the student must have met their behavior goal by not having an office referral during the nine weeks. Students who do not meet this goal will have regular specials or a supplemental activity.

Fundraising and Sale Items

As do all schools, Kings Chapel relies on various fundraisers and sales of supplemental items to support instruction and activities offered throughout the year.
