The development of this year's strategic plan and district goals began during our board retreat



### SUPERINTENDENT SCOTT HAGERMAN UPDATE HONORING EXCELLENCE BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

As we reflect on the past year, it is with pride and gratitude that I share the remarkable achievements of Tanque Verde Unified School District (TVUSD). This year has been exceptional for our district, marked by outstanding accomplishments that underscore our commitment to excellence in education.

#### A-Rated Schools: A Testament to Our Collective Efforts

For the second consecutive year, every school in TVUSD has earned an "A" letter grade from the Arizona Department of Education. This distinction is a testament to the hard work of our students, families, and dedicated staff. Our schools—Agua Caliente Elementary, Tanque Verde Elementary, Emily Gray Junior High, and Tanque Verde High—have demonstrated exceptional performance, reflecting our core values of excellence and integrity.

The A-F School Letter Grades system evaluates schools based on academic growth, proficiency in core subjects like English language arts, math, and science, and readiness indicators for college and careers. Our consistent "A" ratings affirm that we are providing a top-notch educational environment where every student can thrive.

#### **Advancing Student Achievement**

Our commitment to academic excellence is further highlighted by several key achievements:

- Third-Grade Reading Proficiency: Despite the challenges of the pandemic, both Agua Caliente and Tanque Verde Elementary Schools have shown significant growth in third-grade reading proficiency. Agua Caliente's passing rate surged by 25 percentage points, while Tanque Verde Elementary saw a 15-point increase. These gains reflect our strategic efforts in collaborative teaching, data-driven instruction, and re-engagement of students and families.
- Advanced Placement (AP) Success: In 2023, TVUSD was recognized with a Silver Award on the AP School Honor Roll. This accolade celebrates our district's efforts to broaden access to AP courses while maintaining or improving the success rates of our students. Our commitment to equitable access to advanced coursework ensures that all students have the opportunity to excel.

#### Honoring Excellence Beyond the Classroom

Our students and staff continue to shine in various arenas:

**Tanque Verde High School** earned notable rankings in the 2024 U.S. News & World Report's Best High Schools, underscoring our dedication to high academic standards. Additionally, Finn

McGill, a sophomore at Tanque Verde High, has been named a finalist for the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) with his innovative project, A-BiRD, which advances bird research through automated recognition technology.

#### Emily Gray Junior High School

has sustained its excellence with top honors at the Southern Arizona Research, Science, and Engineering Foundation (SARSEF) Fair for five



consecutive years. Our junior high continues to demonstrate its academic prowess through exceptional science projects and a strong focus on mathematics, which has been showcased in the 2023 Solution Tree case study.

Our **Bobcat Athletic Teams** have also made us proud. Emily Gray's teams secured first-place finishes in baseball, softball, girl's soccer, girl's cross country, flag football, and boys basketball in 2023-24 SY. These victories highlight the dedication and talent of our student-athletes and coaches.

#### **Fiscal Responsibility and Recognition**

Maintaining fiscal responsibility is crucial to our mission, and TVUSD has excelled in this area as well. We have received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association for 29 consecutive years. This recognition is a testament to our commitment to transparency and effective financial management.

### **STUDENTS "STEAM" AHEAD**

This year, TVUSD is excited to announce the integration of STEAM classes at the elementary level. STEAM is a teaching approach to inquiry based learning that integrates the disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. Led by instructors, Dr. Maggie Dominguez (ACES) and Mrs. Lisa Nielsen (TVES), the STEAM lessons encourage students to work through problems, take thoughtful risks, engage in hypotheticals, persevere through trial and error and welcome collaboration.

"Our goal for adding the STEAM curriculum is to teach 21st Century Skills through a problem-based learning (PBL) approach while building a culture of STEAM in our community where everyone belongs' explains Ms. Nielsen.

Building on the interest from the STEAM classes, the elementary schools have also launched their first ever after school Odyssey of the Mind Teams. Odyssey of the Mind (OM or OotM) is an international program that teaches students creative problem-solving, teamwork, and performance skills through competition. Teams then develop solutions and present them at competitions on the local, state, and world levels.

OM competitions consist of two primary challenges: the Long-Term Project and Spontaneous Problems. Long-Term Projects are intricate problems that teams work on for months, culminating in a performance at the tournament. Teams might be tasked with problems that are solved through designing and operating a vehicle, constructing a structure that can bear weight, and creating an elaborate skit that addresses a specific theme.

With strict rules and a limited budget, students must be resourceful, often constructing costumes and sets without any outside assistance. The presentation of their solutions and scripted performance is judged on creativity, technical skill, and adherence to the problem's criteria.







In contrast to long-term projects, spontaneous problems require quick thinking and teamwork. These challenges are presented to the teams on the spot during the tournament, with just a few minutes to devise and execute a solution. Spontaneous problems can be verbal, hands-on, or a combination of both, and they test the team's ability to think under pressure and work cohesively.

Both Agua Caliente and Tanque Verde Elementary Schools are forming Primary K-2 grade OM teams, and Secondary 3-6 grade OM teams. Dr. Dominguez and Ms. Nielsen are the district coordinators for the Tanque Verde teams and anticipate participating in the regional tournament in January and the state competition in March.

"One of the most inspiring aspects of OM is the glimpse it provides into the minds of the next generation," said Dr. Dominguez. "The OM competitions are a showcase of what young minds can achieve when given the freedom and confidence to explore, experiment, and take risks. Not only do these students develop valuable skills but also build lasting memories and friendships."

As with any new program, there are some immediate needs. Dr. Dominguez and Mrs. Nielsen are actively recruiting students to join their after school Odyssey of the Mind Teams and Coaches for each team. Coaches can be teachers, parents, relatives, community members or friends ... anyone with a passion for supporting students. Coaching an OM team is a unique experience as coaches are not just mentors; they are facilitators who guide students through the problem-solving process, ensuring that the solutions are entirely student-driven. The goal is to empower students to take ownership of their work and develop the skills they need to work through complex problems.

The skills and strategies mastered in STEAM classes and Odyssey of the Mind are critical components for the 21st century learner. "Odyssey of the Mind drives students to develop and use their natural creativity to become problem-solvers; and that is exactly what STEAM is all about", said Ms. Ms. Nielsen. The challenges, problems and teamwork involved, serves to shape the young minds, and prepare them to tackle the complexities of the real world with creativity, resilience, and optimism.

### **ARTS EDUCATION FLOURISHES**

The Tanque Verde Unified School District has long been a champion of the visual arts, providing students and the adult community with numerous opportunities to explore their creativity and showcase their talents.

Through a variety of events, programs, and projects our dedicated cohort of art teachers, Ms. Michelle O'Donnell (TVES), Ms. Shannon Jefferery (ACES), Ms. Alicia Marrano (EGJH), Ms. Emma Kageyama and Sedona Heidinger (TVHS) plan and develop curriculum and events which serve to enrich the educational experience and foster a deep connection between the schools and the community.

With an emphasis on expressing art using the creative process, students from preschool to twelfth grade learn fundamental techniques of drawing, painting, 3D, printmaking, collage, sculpture and fiber arts scaffolding skills to prepare for the next level.

Elementary grade students rotate through art classes once a week where skills from core subjects are used in expressive efforts. The results are cross curricular projects that align with literature standards and science standards.

"Dot Day, inspired by Peter H. Reynolds' book The Dot, is an annual event at Tanque Verde Elementary," said Ms. O'Donnell. This year Ms. O'Donenell integrated the "Dot Day" art project with the school theme "Better Together". Each creation of concentric circles was pieced together in a school mural, symbolizing unity and collaboration.


At Emily Gray, Ms. Marrano teaches art, advanced art and in response to recent years has added an animation class. In Ms. Marrano's animation classes characters jump to life through student stop-motion animation and flipbook creations.

Powered by grant funded iPads, coursework highlights where students can bridge curriculum from their math courses with artistic efforts to figure out how to calculate frame rates for desired effects.

Tanque Verde High School offers a robust art curriculum designed to cater to students at various levels of expertise and interest, including an AP Art History class. The traditional sequence of Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Art classes build on the art skills from the years before and explore the use of various media and techniques to create and innovate.

The AP Art course challenges students to develop a portfolio that demonstrates their artistic skills and conceptual understanding aligned with the AP Standards.

To showcase our student's creativity, our Art Teachers host several events that bring students, teachers, and the community together to celebrate artistic expression. The Annual School and District Art Shows highlight the



incredible talents of students from all grade levels, displying a wide array of art forms, from paintings and sculptures to digital art and mixed media.

The Chalk Art Marathon is a favorite among TVES students and school community, inspiring young artists with their sidewalk masterpieces. This year the Chalk Art Marathon will go district wide with all district schools participating.

Maintaining a comprehensive Art Program for all students, pre-K through 12 grade has set the Tanque Verde schools apart from those who have had to reduce or cut their art programs altogether. TVUSD's art programs are a testament to fostering creativity and providing students with the tools they need to express themselves. Through talented teachers, showcase events, legacy projects, and innovative classes, TVUSD is dedicated to nurturing the artistic talents of its students, leaving a lasting impact on their path forward.





### **HAWK PRIDE ON & OFF THE FIELD**

As Tanque Verde High School (TVHS) embarks on its 20th year, there is much to celebrate and reflect upon. From humble beginnings with a graduating class of just 25 students in 2008, the high school, housed on a campus designed for the junior high, the high school has grown and outgrown itself, surpassing all expectations. Today, Tanque Verde High School boasts a thriving student body with a current enrollment of over 750 students, 100% graduation rate in 2023, and a diverse offering of over 40 courses that establish clear college, career, and technical pathways for all students.

Tanque Verde High School is a vibrant community of young adults who are encouraged to explore their interests and talents beyond the classroom. The school offers over 25 student clubs and 16 different athletic teams, providing a myriad of choices for students to pursue extracurricular activities. These opportunities play a pivotal role in shaping the school's culture, fostering school spirit, and building a sense of community among students.

"Hawk Pride" is deeply rooted in the school culture, in particular with the

Athletic programs. Over 47% of the student body participates in one or more sports, making it the cornerstone of student life.

Among the 16 sports offered, TVHS teams have claimed many State and Regional Titles, with most teams competing in State competitions at various levels each year.

However, beyond the accolades, the most meaningful contribution of TVHS athletics may be how its studentathletes have helped establish cherished school traditions over the last 20 years. Homecoming, Spirit Weeks, and a strong commitment to community service are just a few examples of how athletic programs help to shape the legacy for future students.

Building on this commitment to service, "Outside the Lines," is a student-athlete club led by advisor and mentor Mr. Gary Lewis. The club is dedicated to helping student-athletes develop skills and values that extend beyond the playing field. "Recognizing that high school may be the final opportunity for many students to compete in organized sports, "Outside the Lines" aims to prepare them for life after athletics by encouraging community involvement and personal growth", explained Mr. Lewis.

Members of "Outside the Lines" have volunteered in numerous service projects, contributing to both their school and the wider community. Recently, the group was inspired by a talk from Jimmy Hart, who emphasized the importance of demonstrating the "8 Habits of the Heart" and looking beyond their immediate surroundings and engaging with the broader world. This program is a testament to TVHS's commitment to developing well-rounded individuals who are ready to make a positive impact, both locally and globally.

Thanks to the successful 2020 bond initiative, Tanque Verde High School has expanded its facilities to better accommodate its growing student population and diverse programs. The school added 19,000 square feet of classroom space and expanded its north end to include a working barn and stables, further enhancing its educational offerings.



In line with the growth in student population, the growth in programs like athletics, marching band, and performing arts has the district researching more physical expansions. The High School hopes to build a track for the track team, add tennis courts and, with the growing interest in Band, Choir and Theater, there is a need for a dedicated Performing Arts Building as well. "Imagine a campus that not only served their students but was an example for how to also serve the community", suggested TVHS Principal Amy Cislak.

"The proposed upgrades would benefit the broader community and the school would become a community hub that hosts community leagues, fitness programs, and larger events like graduation and concerts".

### Tucsonan Bailey Bish found hope, purpose in golf. Today, she's the '24 U.S. Adaptive Open champion

hree years ago, Bailey Bish barely could complete nine holes of golf. Six weeks ago, the Tucsonan

Six weeks ago, the Tucsonan won the 54-hole

U.S. Adaptive Open. How's that for a how it started/how it's going? The challenges Bish, a 24-year-old graduate of Tanque Verde High School It's hard to comprehend and contextualize everything she endures on a daily basis — never mind playing golf at a championship level. But we're going to try.

Difficult-to-control muscle spasms, frequent fainting, erratic vision ... it's a lot. Bish wouldn't let any of it break her. She had goals to achieve. Still does.

Winning the U.S. Adaptive Open is one she can check off the list. The national golf championship for players with disabilities has been around for three years. Competing in the Neurological Impairment category, Bish qualified for the first time last year and finished third. She won it this year, going wire to wire, from July 8-10 at Sand Creek Station in Newton, Kansas.

"We're just so proud of all the hard work and determination that she put in," said Helena Bish, Bailey's mother. "What she had to go through to achieve this goal and the physical challenges she had to overcome."

Helena would know. She's been at Bailey's side for every step – even if, at times, it's been one forward and two back.
