

Owosso Public Schools is the District of Opportunities! We understand the need to provide all students with learning options in an environment that fits their needs and supports their success. We are offering a virtual learning option for students in grades 6-12 for the 2022-23 school year with <u>limited</u> capacity.

Is virtual learning right for my child?

• Students will need a learning coach at home to help facilitate the instructional time.

• Learning will be rigorous and requires the ability to focus and self-guide at times.

• Students and at-home learning coaches must be willing to connect with and communicate regularly with the virtual learning mentor teacher to complete courses.

• Students will need internet access and an internet-accessible device (Chromebook, laptop or desktop computer with a camera and microphone). The district will work with you to provide those items if you do not have internet access and/or a device.

Program Details:

• Students will be enrolled through Owosso High School, Owosso Middle School or Lincoln Alternative High School.

• Online learning will occur at home utilizing the Edgenuity program, an Owosso Board of Education approved learning platform with highly-qualified certified teachers.

• Students will be given a full 7-hour schedule similar to the traditional middle or high school.

• Students can participate in extracurricular activities, student organizations, and athletics. Attendance (logins and two-way contacts) and course progress will be eligibility requirements for participation in these activities, organizations, and athletics.

• Students must commit to a semester (trimester if a Lincoln student) of virtual learning.

• Failure to maintain two-way communication and academic progress can lead to removal from the virtual learning option at semester/trimester and may be grounds for truancy filing.

Virtual Learning Requirements:

• Weekly two-way contact with the virtual mentor teacher is required. This contact should be specific to your academic courses through phone, email, Zoom or Remind text messaging.

• Students will make progress of 7-10% in each assigned course per week to ensure that credit is earned within the semester/trimester.

- Students must commit to a semester (trimester if a Lincoln student) of virtual learning.
- Students MUST attend their assigned school in person for all State of Michigan standardized testing. Failure to take the tests may result in failing to graduate or continuing in virtual learning.
