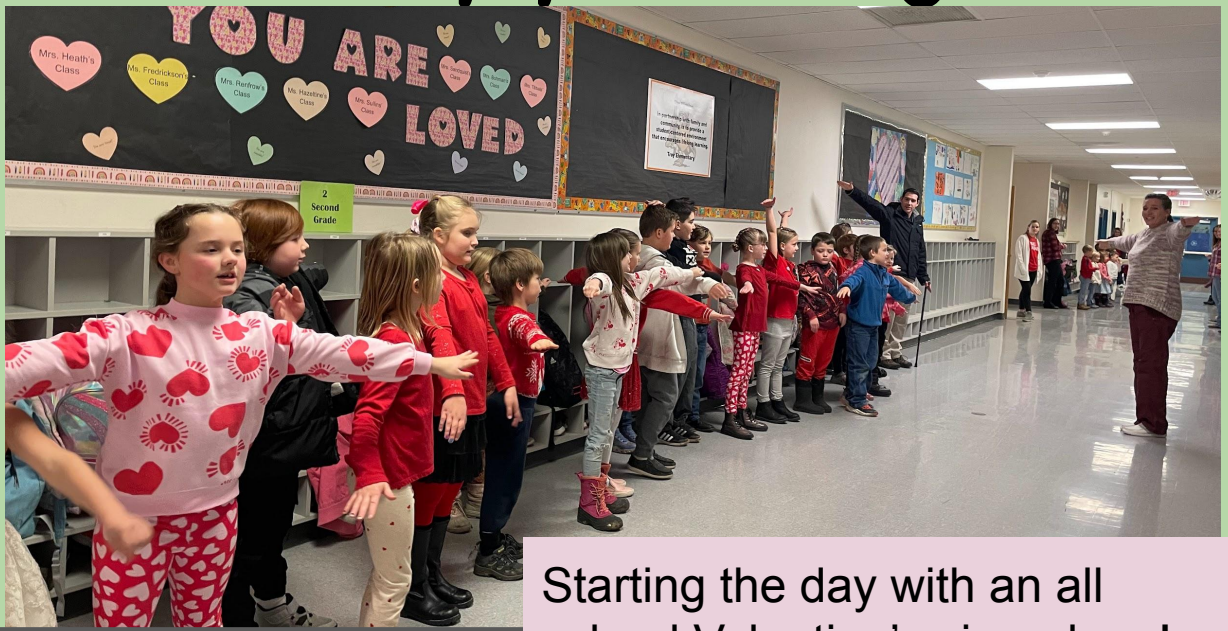

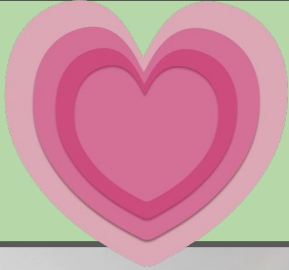


Class Happenings

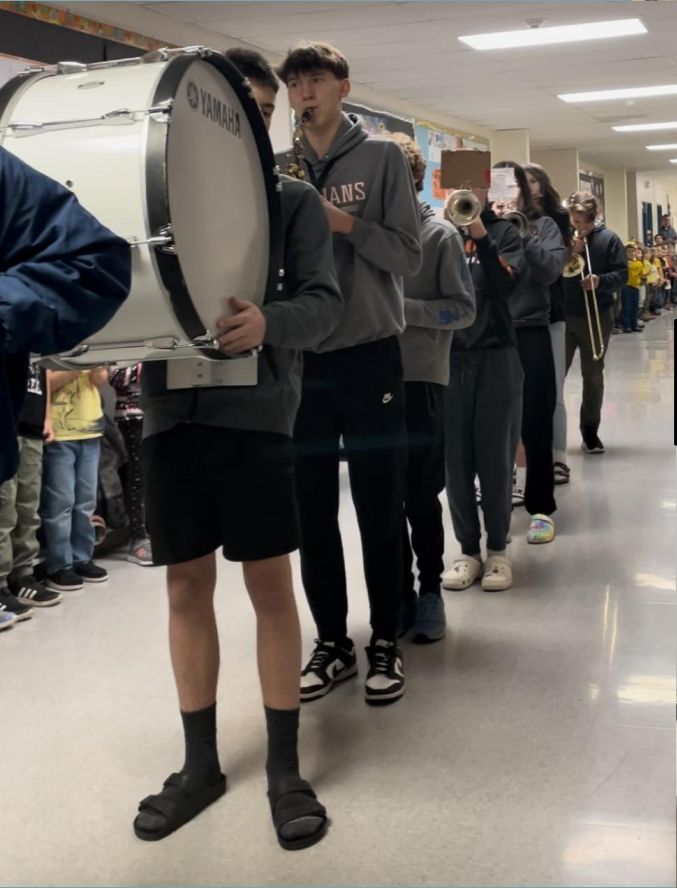
Students carved and created their own hand-stamped Valentine's Cards for their families



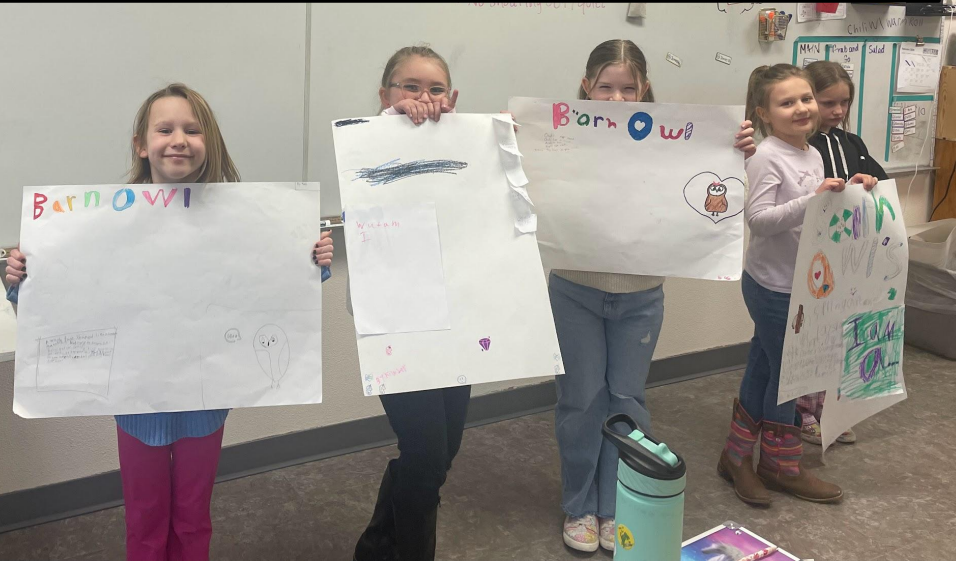
These kiddos live for game days! Here they are playing a board game to learn metric measurement units.
