

# Emergency Rental Assistance



## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Gloucester County has received funds from the U.S. Department of Treasury to provide rental relief to landlords and tenants through the Emergency Rental and Utility Assistance Program (ERAP). Gloucester County will provide rental households financial assistance for unpaid rent and/or utility bills due to impact of COVID-19.

An eligible household may receive up to twelve (12) months of assistance (plus an additional three (3) months if necessary to ensure housing stability for the household, subject to the availability of funds).

## PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Selected households must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify for assistance:

- Qualify for unemployment or have experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due, **directly or indirectly**, to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Demonstrate a risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability
- Have a household income at or below 80 percent of the area median income
- Have a lack of assets and savings to pay rent arrears or current and future rent
- Be a Gloucester County resident
- Obligated to pay rent on a residential dwelling
