Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate and commemorate the feast of Christ the King. As we do so, we celebrate that to Him is all glory, honor, power and kingship, and when He comes again in glory, he will offer all to the Heavenly Father and lead us into eternal praise and worship. It is, therefore, a beautiful feast when we declare that Jesus is Lord not just of Heaven and earth, but also of our hearts and lives. This is important – a heart that is not surrendered is not redeemed.

This Thursday of course we many of us will gather with family and friends to give thanks to the Lord for all He has done for us. I will be hosting my sisters, nieces and nephew, and my sisters' friend who has no one to be with. I look forward to the time with them, and perhaps even the haste of making the meal, though I have it down now regarding timing and menu. Neither of my sisters are in a situation to host, so I will.

Christmas is the same problem, and since they came all the way here from east of Mankato for Thanksgiving, I will go to them, but we meet at a restaurant (my gift to them). I admit that the last years, I came home after the last Mass, and 'moped – the last time saw my mom was Christmas of 2021 (and to be honest, Christmas day has always been a little bittersweet anyway.

This year I have decided to honor my mother, who was loved and respected by so many of my brother priests, by hosting a gathering for the priests and others who have nowhere else to be for meal, perhaps games, and definitely conversation and laughter, and celebrating our diverse cultures and traditions in a very incarnate way (we have a number of international priests that I have invited). I have to say I am happy that we can do this.

Next week, we begin Advent – more on that of course next week, but I do share this. At the Bishop's Conference, they began the discussion of restoring Ember days (season days of prayer), and Friday abstinence from meat.

Whether this is restored formally or not, I strongly recommend Meatless Fridays – Bishop Nienstedt invited us to do so in 2001, and I have maintained that (with a handful of exceptions when I was not in charge of the menu). It is not only good for the soul, but also good for the body, assuming we either fast a little or make healthy food choices of fish or other protein. Advent might be a great time to start; it's only three Fridays.

#### REFLECTION ~ Think about this ...

The Lord's sacramental presence received in Holy Communion will remain for about fifteen minutes until the consecrated host is digested. This time is crucial for remaining and abiding in Christ even after Communion ends.

Focus on the presence of the Almighty dwelling in you, for you are being transformed. With all reverence, kneel when you return to your pew if nothing impedes you. Thank the Lord with all your heart, for you are most unworthy to receive him, who is infinitely perfect.

Thanksgiving is the first appropriate response to such an inconceivable favor. This is also considered the most worthwhile time to ask for a special grace for yourself or someone else. Pour out your heart to him with all your affection.

Let us pray.

Lord, you desire to make us whole so that we may cooperate more fully in your plan of redemption. May the suffering that accompanies your healing hand not discourage us from letting you carry out your magnificent plan in our lives, through which you desire to bless those who encounter us. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.




